RI 4-H will send up to 3 4-H youth and 1 chaperone to this conference. The conference costs about \$1100/youth. This includes conference registration, lodging, flight, ground transportation and most meals. The RI 4-H Foundation is genorusly sponsoring \$850/youth. The chosen deleates will be expected to pay \$250
