

International Admission Quick Facts 2024–2025

WELCOME TO URI

With globally focused academic offerings and hundreds of international learning experiences to choose from, the University of Rhode Island educates students to be culturally competent and ready for an interconnected, interdependent world.

Undergraduate admission is competitive, and each candidate receives individual consideration. Students applying for admission must meet all admission requirements for their level.

FIRST-YEAR APPLICANT

You are a first-year applicant if you are graduating from secondary school and have never enrolled in college, or if you have attended secondary school and college during the same time period (dual enrollment) or have taken some college-level courses during secondary school.

TRANSFER APPLICANT

You are a transfer applicant if you have attended college or university in any capacity after graduating from secondary school – even if you haven't earned any credits.

REQUIRED MATERIALS

All international applicants are required to submit original copies of the following documents in the original language along with a certified word-for-word translation into English with all non-English documents.

It is the applicant's responsibility to request these documents. Your school counselors can assist you in submitting the following documents electronically via the Common Application:

- Secondary school documents, including results and certificates of completion from national secondary school examinations (if applicable).
- Official translations of secondary school documents.
- Letter of recommendation.
 - Pharm.D. requires an additional letter of recommendation from a math/science teacher.
- Official TOEFL/IELTS/Duolingo scores (sent to URI directly by the testing agency).*
- College transcripts (if you have attended a post-secondary school).
- SAT/ACT not required.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Complete the Common Application and submit all required documents. There is a \$65 application fee payable online.

MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

International students with a record of outstanding academic achievement are considered for partial tuition merit scholarships. Awards range in amount and are renewable each year as long as the student maintains the minimum required grade point average. Awards do not cover the costs of room and board or miscellaneous fees.

All applicants are automatically considered for merit scholarships by submitting a completed Common Application. There is no separate scholarship application.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

All international applicants whose first language is not English must provide proof of English language proficiency in the form of official TOEFL/IELTS/Duolingo scores sent to URI directly by the testing agency.

- Required minimum scores:
TOEFL 79; IELTS 6.5; Duolingo English Test 105.
- Note that Pharm.D requires minimum scores of
TOEFL 100; IELTS 7.0; Duolingo English Test 125

Applicants who have attended a secondary school or post-secondary school where the language of instruction is English may be exempt from submitting an English proficiency examination depending upon their English grades (AP, IB, O-level, A-level, GCSE, American Curriculum) and their SAT and/or ACT scores (if submitted). Such exemptions are determined on a case-by-case basis.
