Performance-Based Admission Quick Facts 2025–2026

GENERAL INFORMATION

Eligible non-traditional learners can be considered for admission under performance-based admission (PBA) through URI's Finish What You Started (FWYS) Program.

PBA is available to applicants with no, or limited, prior college attendance whose last formal, full-time educational experience occurred at least three years ago, and who have graduated from high school or earned a general equivalency diploma (GED).

Transcripts are due no later than 10 days after the application deadline. Note: The Office of Admission does not evaluate credit. Credit evaluations are completed by the academic colleges within 21 days of acceptance.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Please submit the following:

- · Completed application with \$65 fee.*
- Official high school transcript, unless you have an associate's or bachelor's degree with coursework similar in content to what is offered at URI.
- If applicable, official electronic or official printed transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended, regardless of whether you desire or expect to receive credit for such work. Electronic transcripts should be emailed to: transferadmission@uri.edu.
- Resume.
- Letter of recommendation.
- Please note that an interview is required for PBA applicants.

CONDITIONAL ADMISSION

As a performance-based admission student, you will be admitted to University College for Academic Success (UCAS). You will benefit from close communication with a team of professionals and your PBA academic advisor. You will follow a detailed academic plan for your first 15 probationary credits and you will be required to maintain a 2.0 grade point average.

You will also be required to complete UCS/SPC 305 Learning and Career Principles for Adult Students, a course designed specifically for PBA/Adult Learners. This mandatory course will not only lay the groundwork for your successful transition to URI, but will also help you create a supportive network of peers, faculty, and staff. Additional coursework will be determined by your academic advisor.

Each semester your academic achievement will be reviewed by a UCAS advisor until you reach 15 credits. Once you have successfully completed the probationary requirements, you will automatically be eligible to start degree programs.
