



GENERAL EDUCATION GUIDELINES: General education is 40 credits. Each of the twelve outcomes (A1-D1) must be met by at least 3 credits. A single course may meet more than one outcome, but cannot be double counted towards the 40 credit total. At least one course must be a Grand Challenge (G). No more than twelve credits can have the same course code (note- HPR courses may have more than 12 credits). General education courses may also be used to meet requirements of the major or minor when appropriate.

Degree Requirements: Students with fewer than 24 credits that are accepted to URI are College of Business students that are coded for a unique, first year experience. Students who complete 24 credits with a GPA of 2.5 or higher are able to continue as part of the degree program.

Transfer Students may apply to this major by completing a transfer application. For more information on requirements for transfer students go to URI transfer admissions.

Continuation in the program is contingent upon students maintaining a minimum grade point average of 2.00. Students should consult with their Academic Advisor for more information on program requirements.

General Education consists of 40 credits. For more details regarding General Education, please go to the Academic Requirements and Policies section of this catalog.

Major Requirements. Business Studies students need to earn 42-credits to graduate with the major.

Thirty (30) credits are required.

This includes LDR290; and BUS325 or ACC201; and BAI110 or BAI310; and INE140G; and MGT201; and INE247; and INE304G; and MGT341 Organizational Behavior; and MGT343 or INE348; and SCA415 Project Management.

Twelve (12) credits from electives can be taken (to have 42 credits).

The following courses would be recommended for a **Tourism Leadership pathway**: PRS200 Introduction to Event Management; MKT366 Consumer Behavior; MKT469 Special Topics in Marketing: Sustainable Tourism; MAF471 Critical Island Studies; MAF472 Critical Studies of Tourism and Ecotourism; and an internship in the tourism industry (MGT493).

An internship, approved co-operative, or work experience is required. Internships can be for credit or listed for zero credit (BUS392 or BUS493). Up to 24 co-op or prior learning credits can be applied as electives toward the 120 credits.

Graduation Requirements:

1. A minimum of 120 credits with an overall GPA of 2.0. An overall GPA of 2.0 (including all attempts) is mandatory for the 300 and 400 level courses required for the major. 42 credits need to be taken at the 300-level or higher.
2. Half of the credits (4 courses) in the major must be completed at URI.
3. All 300- and 400-level Business courses required for the major must be taken at an AACSB accredited business school.

Transfer Credit Requirements:

1. Students who wish to study at another college or university must obtain prior approval from the Dean's office and earn a grade of C or better for the credits to transfer. Students will receive credit on their transcripts and not a letter grade.
2. Credit transferred from a community or junior college is limited to half the credits required for the University of Rhode Island degree. For a degree in business, that limit is 60 credits.
3. Junior and Senior Business courses not completed at an AACSB accredited college will be transferred as free elective credits only.

Honors

To receive a notation on their transcripts stating they have "completed the University Honors Program," students must take 24 credits in Honors Program courses (transfer students may take 18). Honors Program credits include:

HPR 100-level course (meets Gen Ed requirements)(3 crs.) Honors Colloquium (HPR 2XX) (4 credits)

HPR 401 Honors Project (min. 3 crs.) (D1)

HPR 403 Honors Reflections (1 credit) (pre-req. Honors reflection journal completion across 4 years) One HPR/H-Section course (can meet Gen Ed.) (3 crs min.)

Honors Electives (10 credits):

Learning experiences (max 8 crs.); Honors Contracts (8 crs.); HPR/H-section courses; Graduate-level courses
