Requirements to enter the College of Nursing: BIO 220, BIO 221, BIO 222, BIO 223, CHM 103, CMB 201, NUR 100 with a grade of "C" or better; cumulative GPA of at least 3.0.

All nursing and other program courses (see above) require a "C" or better for progression through the curriculum.

Entry and Progression Policy

- **Entry into the College of Nursing is competitive and seats are limited.** Students are required to have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 and a grade of "C" or better in all prerequisite courses to be considered. Entrance into the College of Nursing and clinical course sequence is *not* guaranteed once meeting these requirements. Placement is competitively granted based on success in prerequisite criteria. The College of Nursing and clinical course sequence is determined at the close of the summer session 2 term for fall entrance only.
- Students who have not met the pre-requisite criteria for transfer to the College of Nursing and the clinical course sequence by the end of two years or sixty credits will be required to choose a different major at the University.
- **Progression through the College of NUR** requires a "C" or better in all NUR courses and a minimum 2.20 GPA. Students are allowed to repeat a single NUR course. Should a student need to repeat a class or otherwise fall out of sequence continuation will be on a space available basis and is *not* guaranteed. The student will be notified of eligibility.
- **Dismissal Policy:** Performance below a grade of "C" in any 2 nursing courses will result in dismissal from the College of Nursing. Please refer to the University Catalog and The College of Nursing Student Handbook for full details.
