All prospective World Language Education students should apply to the College of Education during the spring semester of Year 2. Applications are due annually in January. Academic advising is available in University College prior to admission for both the World Language Education major and the A&S major. Upon acceptance, students will be assigned a World Language Education advisor in the College of Education and students will be assigned an A&S major advisor in the department of that major.

Starting in Year 3, Education courses are offered only in the semesters indicated. Students who must miss a semester, e.g. to study abroad, should meet with their College of Education advisor as early as possible to determine how to complete the required course sequence, e.g. by taking summer courses.
