Preparing for your Career

- Develop quantitative skills through additional courses in math, statistics, and accounting.
- Demonstrate interpersonal and communication skills by having well-rounded experiences outside the classroom.
- Actively participate in student organizations to develop leadership skills & learn to work well with a team.
- Develop skills in the ability to analyze and interpret data.
- Cultivate an eye for detail.
- Pursue internships to learn about the field and gain experience. Consider completing multiple internships during the school year and/or the summer to build more connections.
- Read *The Wall Street Journal* and other financial news magazines to become versed in current events and industry vocabulary.
- Seek leadership roles in finance-specific <u>College of Business student organizations</u>.
- Research professional designations and licenses (e.g. Chartered Financial Analyst or Certified Financial Planner).
- If interested in working for an international corporation, gain language skills and work toward becoming multilingual.
- Conduct informational interviews with professionals in field of interest to learn more about their work and build a network of contacts.
