Preparing for your Career

- Develop linguistic skills & become fluent in multiple languages.
- Demonstrate intercultural competency, sensitivity, and tolerance.
- Gain experience communicating with people from other cultures. Seek opportunities for cross-national interactions on campus or in your community.
- Study abroad, work abroad, or travel to a foreign country while in school to develop language skills and international competency.
- Follow international news sources in a target location or region to stay on top of current events, business trends, real estate markets, etc.
- Get your foot in the door at multinational corporations through domestic positions.
 Many international employers promote current employees to international positions.
- Learn about international travel regulations including specific visa requirements for the country/ies you are traveling to/working in.
- Define career goals and seek experiences and skills related to those goals.
- Learn about various fields of business through research on Internet sites, informational interviews of professionals, and exposure to work environments through shadowing, volunteering, or interning.
- Actively participate in student organizations to develop interpersonal and organizational skills. Strong communication skills, including public speaking, are also important to achieving success in this field.
- Join relevant College of Business clubs to gain knowledge about professions of interest.
- Develop and utilize a personal network of contacts. Find an experienced mentor.
- Conduct informational interviews with professionals in field of interest to learn more about their work and build a network of contacts.
