- Choose electives and major/minor courses that relate to your career interests
- Get involved in [research](#) with professors

- Serve as a teaching assistant or [tutor](#)
- Maintain a strong GPA

#### Experience

- Participate in [volunteer work or community service](#)
- Try out internships (multiple if possible!) in your field; consider [internships for credit](#) during the school year or over the summer
- Identify [transferable skills](#) gained from work experience
- Get to know professionals in the field through the [URI Alumni Network](#)
- Attend [career fairs & networking events](#) to connect with employers
- Use [Handshake](#) to find internships, on-campus jobs, and part-time jobs.

#### Activities & Accomplishments

- [Get involved](#) in clubs, organizations, athletic teams, etc. on campus
- Pursue leadership roles in your community
- Get connected with [professional associations](#); take advantage of on-campus chapters and/or discounted membership rates for students
- Maintain a portfolio with evidence of your work experience, activities, & accomplishments

## Experience

Consider your employment background; internships; academic projects; extended volunteer work; training & certifications

Consider campus & community organizations; clubs; athletics; travel; fraternities/sororities; professional associations; leadership positions; elected offices

## Skills & Personal Attributes

Consider computer & language skills; technical & scientific abilities; use of equipment; interpersonal & communication skills; areas of excellence; teamwork & competition; hobbies & leisure activities
