Once admitted into the program, candidates have up to five years to complete the certification and degree if they prefer more flexible pacing than outlined below.

Undergraduate Requirements

Complete six TESOL/BDL credits in addition to the 120 required for the B.A. Apply to the M.A. in TESOL/BDL program by April 1 of senior year. An undergraduate GPA of 3.0 is required to apply.

Undergraduate Requirements

Complete six TESOL/BDL credits in addition to the 120 required for the B.A. Apply to the M.A. in TESOL/BDL program by April 1 of senior year. An undergraduate GPA of 3.0 is required to apply. Take EDC 427/527 in the fall of your senior year. The course is required to fulfill the Right to Read requirements for certification.
