Dear Governor McKee,

I appreciate the opportunity to highlight the University of Rhode Island's (URI) fiscal year 2027 (FY27) budget request and thank you and the General Assembly for your continued support of the State of Rhode Island's public, flagship, land- and sea- grant university.

The University of Rhode Island has momentum, due in large part to the increases in the operating budget and robust investments by the state in capital infrastructure over the past several years. This funding has allowed URI to continue to execute on the vision outlined in our strategic plan, Focus URI, while advancing the RI 2030 Plan. A multi-year continued commitment to URI is important to our future, and it will unlock the full potential of the University for the state.

This year, I will continue to focus on reaching several strategic goals, including implementing a new budget model, which will allow the University to better align costs with revenue, open up new revenue streams, and provide more transparency to the University community. With your support of URI's FY27 general appropriation request of \$139.7 million, a 20% increase in the URI General FTE Cap, and capital investment plan, we can continue to meet the goals of the RI 2030 plan.

URI is the state's public flagship research university, and I hope you take pride, as I do, in the recent *Wall Street Journal* rankings of the best 500 colleges and universities in the U.S., which ranked URI the number one public university in New England. This is a testament to the work we are doing together.

Total Budget

URI's FY27 Budget Request totals \$1.2 billion, which includes an Unrestricted Request of \$629.1 million, a Restricted Request of \$521.5 million, and a State Crime Lab Request of \$2.4 million. The budget request also includes a proposed increase of 20% in the overall FTE cap. The attached budget package reflects the details of each segment of the budget.

Operating Budget

For FY27, the University is facing an inflationary increase for FY27 in the cost of doing business at the current level of service (CSL), totaling \$23.6 million. And to meet our mission as the state's public flagship research university, we are requesting an additional \$10.2 million to support URI's strategic plan that will: 1) broaden our impacts; 2) address student outcomes through enhanced advising support; 3) support Talent Development, National Guard, and the Narragansett Tribal Scholarship, and 4) modernize IT infrastructure that will support long-term financial stability.

Final approval of tuition and mandatory fees shifted to the February Board of Trustees meeting, which allows the University to make better enrollment forecasts, better understand the tuition and fees of our peers— many of whom approve tuition in the winter through summer months—and ultimately better estimate the financial impact of tuition and mandatory fee levels on the University and our students and families. This FY27 budget submission includes a baseline assumption of a 3% increase in tuition and a 2% increase in mandatory fees, which we will update after the February 2026 Board of Trustees meeting.

Higher education is a people-centric industry that relies heavily on our talented faculty and staff to provide a world-class education, conduct groundbreaking research, and provide a vibrant living and learning environment for our students. As one of the state's largest employers, URI is driving many of the goals of the RI2030 plan: improving education outcomes, income growth, workforce development, and economic growth.

We are therefore requesting an increase in the University's General FTE cap in FY27 of 20%, totaling 542 FTEs. More FTEs are essential because enrollment growth is currently outpacing staffing and overall, the University has experienced flat staffing during expansion from FY19-24. Additionally, there is a structural inequity as research-funded positions have a carve-out, but auxiliary positions (housing and dining) that are self-supported by fees, do not. Finally, URI is well below peer R1 universities in staffing in many areas, including student advising, human resources, IT, research administration, marketing, and legal. URI intends to continue dialogue with OMB and legislative staff about the value of holding URI to an FTE cap.

Capital Investment Plan

URI's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) submitted in August, includes a total RICAP request of \$213.6 million above the existing appropriations, with \$124.2 million of that requested for projects that start in FY27. The Asset Protection Program is the principal means by which the University performs major renovation and replacement of its extensive, general fund-supported physical plant assets, with auxiliary enterprises supporting a similar program for their plant assets. The University is responsible for 322 buildings constructed over the span of 130 years, approximately 28% of the State's square footage (including auxiliary buildings). This encompasses 5.8 million square feet, as well as the supporting utility infrastructure, including University-maintained high voltage electrical, water, steam, sewer, drainage, pavement, hydrant, fire alarm and security alarm systems. Consistent annual RICAP funding allows URI to sustain the integrity and function of these facilities.

General Obligation Bond

URI is training the next generation health care workforce for the state through its programs in the College of Nursing, Pharmacy, and Health Sciences. The 2026 general obligation bond proposal is \$165.7 million for the new Integrated Health Building that will provide expanded programming to support interprofessional education and clinical training in the health disciplines. This project would accelerate health care workforce development for the state by providing learning space and state-of-the-art simulation laboratories to accommodate URI's growing enrollment in Nursing and enable interdisciplinary training across URI's health disciplines (Nursing, Pharmacy, and Health Sciences). Located on the Kingston campus, the new facility will expand upon existing resources at RINEC, while providing all undergraduate students with access to critical skills and resources. Support of this G.O. bond will ensure that Rhode Island can meet its growing healthcare workforce needs, directly supporting RI 2030 Plan's goal of improving health outcomes through expanded training capacity and access to modern simulation-based education.

Looking Ahead

Over the past several fiscal years, with the support of your administration and the General Assembly, URI received a significant and healthy increase in funding for both our operating and capital budget. The result is that URI is the #1 public university in New England and an R1 research institution. URI's momentum is advancing the goals of the RI 2030 Plan and unlocking economic growth for the state. With an evolving and challenging federal landscape, your support of our FY27 general appropriation request of \$139.7 million is incredibly important.

Our mission is directly aligned with the state's and, with your support, I believe URI will grow to be a stronger entrepreneurial hub of activity that will generate revenue for Rhode Island, create sustainable and equitable jobs, and bring transformative innovation, business, industry, partnerships, and critical, competitive funding to the state.

Thank you again for your partnership and your leadership. I firmly believe that, together, we can achieve our shared goals for the University and for all Rhode Islanders.

Proposal Overview (brief)

The constrained budget, which reflects a \$31.1M decrease from the unconstrained request, will prevent URI from playing a critical role in the Governor's goal of increasing graduation rates. In order to address this State Appropriation, and since State Appropriation supports tuition of RI residents, in-state tuition rates will be increased in order to maintain services. This budget also reduces the Jason Project by \$10,192 which was not exempted from the state instructions.

The constrained budget, which reflects a \$680,974 decrease from the unconstrained request, will prevent the State Crime Lab from carrying out its mission. Thus, a revenue stream would be initiated that would charge law enforcement agencies throughout the state.

Opportunity Statement

URI's problem arises from the possible \$31.1M reduction in State Appropriation. Since State Appropriation supports RI residents' tuition, the in-state tuition has been increased to offset the removal of support for RI residents.

The State Crime Lab's problem arises from the \$680,974 reduction in state appropriation. Since the state appropriation supports the State Crime lab, client charges would be initiated to offset the removal of support for the Crime Lab.

Proposal Details

Offsetting the reduction in state appropriation by increasing in-state tuition will enable the university to continue to provide high-quality educational programming to incoming and current students.

Responding to the reduction in state appropriation by cutting services would increase the backlog of cases already facing the Crime Lab, thereby severely impacting the Crime Lab's ability to serve law enforcement agencies across the state.

Future Expected Costs

If state appropriation were not restored to unconstrained levels, then an elevated in-state tuition rate would continue to be required in order for the university to carry out its mission.

If state appropriation were not restored to unconstrained levels, then charging law enforcement agencies would continue to be required in order for the Crime Lab to carry out its mission.

Relationship to Agency Mission

If state appropriation were not restored to the unconstrained request level, then the measures outlined in the constrained budget would continue to be required in order for the university to carry out its mission.

Timeline for Implementation

The in-state tuition increase would become effective Fall 2026.

The State Crime Laboratory Commission would need to approve charges to clients prior to the start of the FY2027 fiscal year.

As a result of enacting the Target Budget for FY2027, the following change is proposed to RIGL § 12-1.2-4.

Section Changes

This section amends RIGL § 12-1.2-4 to allow the State Crime Laboratory to charge other law enforcement agencies for a portion of the cost of services rendered.

Budget/Policy Impact of Section Changes

Currently, the sole source of revenue for the State Crime Laboratory is state appropriation. In recent months, the number of cases referred to the Laboratory has increased, resulting in a backlog that would only grow if this appropriation were reduced. In order to continue to fulfill its mission under this scenario, the State Crime Lab would seek to initiate a new revenue stream by charging law enforcement agencies in order to offset the reduction.


