For Posters:

- Font Type: Use clean and professional fonts like Arial, Helvetica, or Calibri.
- Title Size: 72–120 pt (to make it stand out and visible from a distance).
- Section Headers: 36–48 pt.
- **Body Text:** 20–36 pt (easy to read from 3–5 feet away).
- Line Spacing: 1.5 to ensure text doesn't feel crowded
- **Poster dimensions** are 60"W X 40"H or 48" x 36"

Oral Presentations

For Oral Presentations (Slides):

- Font Type: Stick to sans-serif fonts like Arial, Calibri, or Verdana for readability.
- Title Size: 32–44 pt.
- Bullet Point Text: 24–28 pt.
- Captions/Footnotes (if necessary): 18–20 pt.
- Line Spacing: Single or 1.15 for neatness.
- **Duration**: Each presenter will have 15 minutes for their talk, followed by a Panel discussion (Coordinated by Said Faculty Member) for Q&A.

Content:

- Title slide, introduction, and objectives.
- Key points (Including Methods) with supporting visuals (e.g., slides or video).
- Clear conclusion summarizing findings or insights.
- Authors/References

- **Submission**: Slides should be submitted in [PowerPoint] by [28/03/25] to gsagradconference@gmail.com
- A **10-minute presentation** might use around **8–12 slides** (including a title and conclusion slide).
- A **15-minute presentation** could have approximately **12–15 slides**.

This ensures you have enough visual support without overwhelming the audience or rushing through the content. It's also a good idea to keep slides concise, focusing on key points with visuals rather than text-heavy content.
