Professional journalists from all media who want to understand the practice of scientific research, gain a grounding in climate change science and the clean energy transition, and sharpen skills in climate change reporting are invited to apply for a 2023 Metcalf Institute fellowship.

The 25th Annual Science Immersion Workshop fellowships will support journalists who:

1) have a demonstrated interested in expanding and/or improving their reporting on climate change,

2) have minimal or no science background, and

3) can demonstrate how the Annual Workshop will benefit their reporting, specifically, and career, generally.

The application package consists of this online application form, links to work samples, a resume and two references via our online reference form. All materials must meet the application deadline.

APPLICATION FORM

The application requires that you select two samples of your reporting (or up to 15 photographs for photojournalists) that have been published or aired by a news outlet within the past 24 months (or 3 years for photojournalists). The original date and venue of publication or broadcast must be easily identifiable. You may choose samples from different media and/or outlets.

Broken links or links that present paywalls are not considered acceptable samples. If functional web links are not available, applicants may upload PDFs or YouTube links with original date and venue of publication or broadcast for each sample as part of this application form.

All application materials, including work samples, must be in English or an English translation must be provided to fellowships@metcalfinstitute.org as part of the application package.

Any issues with completing or submitting the application form or uploading your resume or work sample links should be reported to fellowships@metcalfinstitute.org immediately in order to allow time for resolution and successful application submission no later than 11:59 p.m. Eastern Standard Time, Monday, February 6, 2023. Application forms must be submitted by the deadline to be considered for a 2023 Metcalf fellowship.

Two professional references are required via a <u>Metcalf Workshop Reference Form</u>. These two people should be able to evaluate the potential impacts of the Metcalf fellowship on your professional work and your news audience(s). One reference form must be completed by your current immediate supervisor or, for freelancers, an editor who has most recently worked with you. Applicants should direct authors of their professional references to the Metcalf website for the online form. Your professional references must be completed by 11:59 p.m. Eastern Standard Time, Monday, February 6, 2023, for your application to be considered for a fellowship.
