## **Policy Statement**

All Hot Work on University of Rhode Island property shall comply with the provisions of this policy and be permitted using the designated form, available from the Coordinator of Fire and Life Safety in the Department of Public Safety, regardless of whether the work is performed by University of Rhode Island employees, contractors, or other parties. Any Hot Work being conducted without a valid Hot Work permit will be immediately halted.

This Hot Works policy is applicable only to physical plant construction, repairs, and maintenance activities on University property and does not apply to similar activities involving open flame welding, brazing, soldering, etc. that is part of University research or learning activities (i.e., labs, art studios, fabrication, etc.)



The University's Coordinator of Fire & Life Safety shall have authority over all matters related to the Hot Work permitting process, including the right to order work stopped immediately if an appropriate Hot Work permit has not been issued.

It is the responsibility of the individual engaged in Hot Work to ensure that they have a current Hot Work Permit in place before undertaking any Hot Work task, and that the Hot Work permit is closed out upon completion of that task.
