

UNITED STATES NAVAL WAR COLLEGE/CORNELL UNIVERSITY INTERNSHIP PROGRAMS

The U.S. Naval War College in Newport as well as the Gender and the Security Sector Lab at the Department of Government at Cornell University sponsor an internship program for University of Rhode Island students that allows student interns to work with faculty members from the Naval War College and Cornell University on their research projects. Typical assignments include conducting research, writing short reports, data collection, editing and fact checking papers, compiling bibliographies.

This unpaid internship program provides students with a chance to work on significant issues in national security and strategic studies. Students may receive up to 6 hours of academic credit (Pass/Fail) by enrolling in PSC 375 or 376. Students working 100 hours may receive 3 credits; those working 130 hours or more may receive 4 credits.

This internship is open to both advanced undergraduate and graduate students.

Student Requirements:

- Political Science Major or International Relations Minor
- Overall GPA: 3.0 or higher and a political science GPA of 3.2 or higher
- A minimum of 60 overall credits already completed
- At least one 300-level or above course in International Relations
