Mariyam Abbas, M.A. is a second-year Behavioral Sciences Ph.D. student at the University of Rhode Island working with Dr. Theodore A. Walls. She is a first-generation Ph.D. student hailing from Lucknow, India. Her research focuses on health risk behaviors, particularly addictive behaviors such as smoking, alcohol use, and smartphone addiction, with an emphasis on cognitive and positive psychology perspectives. She also investigates the role of acculturative stress among Indian Americans and South Asian populations, especially within socioeconomically disadvantaged communities. In addition to her academic work, Mariyam had developed a child meliorism program, earning her a fellowship from ASha Education Zurich, which aimed to support underprivileged socioeconomically backward children in India.



Gabriella (Gabby) Epshteyn M.A., is a second-year Clinical Psychology Ph.D. student at the University of Rhode Island. Prior to coming to URI, Gabby served as the Research Manager of the Transitioning Service Member / Veteran And Suicide Prevention Center (TASC), as well as the Co-Investigator/Program Manager for Dialectical Behavior Therapy For Justice-Involved Veterans (DBT-J) the James J. Peters VA Medical Center. Gabby continues to conduct research with the TASC team as well as maintaining a research affiliate role with the Yale School Of Medicine, Department Of Psychiatry. Gabby's research focuses on themes suicide, trauma, substance use, personality disorders and the adaptation of culturally adapted mindfulness-based interventions. She is particularly interested in high-risk, high-need underrepresented and socioeconomically disadvantaged populations including active duty service members, Veterans, justice-involved Veterans and incarcerated persons.
