- New Business (Mike J.)
 - Clery Report Overview (Mike J.)
 - The Department of Public Safety prepares the Annual Security and Fire Safety Report with assistance from Student Affairs personnel, Title IX Office, Enterprise Risk Management, and VPAS. Requires certain crimes, known as Clery crimes, be recorded in a yearly report along with statistics from the previous two years.
 - Stop Campus Hazing Act enacted December 2024 amends Clery Act to prioritize the prevention of and transparency about hazing incidents. Any hazing incidents reported on or after January 1, 2025, must be documented and included in next year's Clery Act reporting cycle.
 - Working on monthly meetings with the campus partner to strengthen the partnership for tracking
 - Campus Security Authorities (CSAs) - officials of the institution who have significant responsibility for student and campus activity, including, but not limited to, student housing, student discipline, and campus judicial proceedings. The next CSA training, which occurs each year, is due before June 20, 2026
