











# **ECHO® Learning Series:**

Supporting People Living with Dementia and their Care Partners - Identifying Community
Clinical Linkages to Deliver Dementia and Age-Friendly Care

#### What is ECHO®?

ECHO® is a virtual learning community offered at no cost. Participants may also be eligible for a \$250.00 incentive payment.

This all-teach, all-learn model includes a brief presentation from a subject-matter expert followed by a case study to elicit discussion and recommendations. Participants exchange information, experiences, cases, and ideas and receive feedback from other participants and the multidisciplinary hub team of content experts.

### **Purpose**

We will focus on strategies to improve care for older adults with dementia based on the <u>4M</u> <u>framework</u>: What Matters Most, Medications, Mentation, and Mobility. These strategies will help primary care practices and other organizations deliver care aligned with the age-friendly approach. Participants will collaborate with each other and engage in ongoing learning.

### **Intended Audience**

- Primary care practice providers and teams
- Geriatricians
- Home care agencies
- Nursing home and assisted living staff
- Community health workers
- Nurse Care Managers, RNs, LPNs
- OT, PT, SLP, social work, and behavioral health clinicians
- Pharmacists
- Other healthcare professionals

## Two options for participation

- <u>Full participation:</u> Participate in at least three of four sessions and be willing to present a case (includes \$250.00 incentive payments for up to 20 individuals or sites; see registration for details).
- <u>Flexible participation:</u> Attend individual sessions with no commitment to sharing a case (no incentive payment).

#### **Format**

Online sessions will include a brief presentation by a dementia-care expert followed by a case discussion.
