



Message from the PMS



Hello to the entire Alumni! Once again, another school year has quickly come and gone. As usual, the Cadets of the Cramer's Sabers BN have performed brilliantly throughout the year. From the start of the academic year at Zero Week through the commissioning of the newest 11 2LTs, the Cadets have made Cadre, Staff, and I am sure, the alumni extremely proud. Our most recent 2LTs that commissioned on 18 May consisted of five Active Duty Officers (1x Armor, 2x Infantry, 1x Military Intelligence branch detailed Infantry, and 1x Nurse), one Reserve Officer (Med Service), and five National Guard Officers that will serve in various states, to include RI, MA and CT among others. Following Cadet Summer Training (CST), we anticipate commissioning three more 2LTs with one more 2LT going Active Duty (Air Defense) and two serving in the National Guard. At that point, the program will meet its annual mission of 15 cadets commissioning this FY as we commissioned one 2LT in December 2022.

This newsletter will highlight several recent events. Along with regular classes and Physical Fitness Training, training included the CFTX with PC, 5 Labs, Award Ceremony, Military Ball, 12-Mile Foot march, and the first official ACFT in program history among others. In addition, this newsletter will highlight two incredible events. First, 10 cadets competed in the marathon length Boston Tough Ruck

with fantastic results. Second, based on the financial support of the Cramer's Sabers BN Alumni, three 2man male teams' competed in the University of Kansas Ranger Buddy Competition, finishing 4th, 17th, and 19th respectively out of ninety 2-man teams. Moreover, based the aforementioned high finishes, the program won the male team division. This is out of 45 ROTC programs from across the country!!!! Beginning in late May, and throughout the summer, 11 cadets will attend CST Advanced Camp, three will attend CST Basic Camp, and 4 cadre will support CST at Fort Knox, KY. Upon everyone's return from CST, the program will welcome seven National Scholarship winners (up from two last year) and nine more that have already pledged to be part of the program in the fall. This is a great start for the incoming freshmen (MS1) class.

A special thanks goes out to so many of our partners at three universities. Each of the schools continue as huge supporters of the Program. A big thanks also goes to URI President Marc Parlange and the Dean of the College of Arts and Science, Jen Riley, the Salve Regina Provost, Nancy Schreiber, Associate Dean of Students at Salve Regina University, Jen Jensen, Roger Williams Provost, Margaret Everett, and Eric Brunson, Dean of Criminal Justice at Roger Williams for all they do for the cadets at URI, Salve Regina and Roger Williams respectively.

Lastly, as always, thank you to the URI ROTC Alumni for all you do. The cadets and cadre cannot thank you enough. Your recent financial assistance with the University of Kansas Ranger Buddy, Military Ball, and cadet AGSUs is second to none.

URI Alumni graciously funds and provides the opportunity for the Cramer's Sabers Ranger Challenge team and coach to travel to 3rd BDE, Kansas University's 49th annual Ranger Buddy competition during easter weekend 8-9 April. Through their relentless dedication and perseverance, sacrificing several evenings and weekends, URI Cadets found incredible success in an EIB based ranger competition. Travelling into rival territory, 2nd BDE (Freedom BDE) Cadets tested their skills against 91, 3rd BDE all male division teams and 45 programs, where URI placed 1st in the all-male division and 4th, 13th & 17th as



TOUGH RUCK COMPETITION

On 16 April, ten Cramer's Sabers cadets participated in the Tough Ruck. A 26.2 mile race with a 35 lbs. minimum ruck in honor of fallen soldiers and their families. To participate, each cadet raised a minimum \$450 for the Military Friends Foundation, a Massachusetts charity which honors all those who were killed in the line of duty and assists their families. The race began with a ceremony featuring keynote speaker, General James C. McConville, Chief of Staff of the Army and a speech by a gold star father, remembering all who have given their life in service and thanking the participants for rucking in their memory. The race began in the historic city of Concord and moved east to Lexington, starting and ending in Minute Man National Historical Park, the site where the first shots of the Revolutionary War were fired. All participants who complete the race in under 9:00:00 are given an authentic Boston Marathon medal, coinciding with the race that is held the next day. Our cadets showed incredible athletic capability and mental fortitude with all ten cadets finishing the race under the 9:00:00 mark. The cadets completed the race in the uniform heavy category. The cadets honorably represented the Cramer's Sabers Battalion raising over \$5,000 for the Military Friends Foundation and finishing as one of the top ROTC programs and the only program to carry the battalion guidon the entire way. The ROTC PROGRAM AND ALUMNI CHAPTER WELCOME SFC JEFFERY R. HOLOMUZKI TO URI

SFC Jeffrey Holomuzki was born in Lexington, Kentucky on 04 March 1989. He enlisted into the United States Army as an 11B Infantryman 23 April 2012. He graduated from Bravo Company, 1st Battalion, 19th Infantry Regiment (OSUT).

SFC Holomuzki was assigned to Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 1st Battalion, 26th Infantry Regiment, 3rd IBCT, 1st Infantry Division, at Fort Knox, Kentucky. He held duty positions as a reconnaissance scout, radio-telephone operator, and senior reconnaissance scout. In 2013, he deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom with a Combined Joint Special Operations Task Force.

Upon his return from Afghanistan in 2014, SFC Holomuzki was reassigned to Alpha Company, 1st Battalion, 327th Infantry Regiment, 1st IBCT, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault). SFC Holomuzki He deployed once again to Afghanistan in March 2015 in support of Operation Freedom's Sentinel as a fire team and rifle squad leader.

SFC Holomuzki served as a weapons squad leader during Operation Judicious Activation, Gabon in 2017. There he led his squad on embassy security operations in conjunction with the USMC and cross-training with Host Nation Forces.

In 2018, SSG Holomuzki was placed on assignment to Alpha Company, 2nd Battalion, 35th Infantry Regiment, 3rd IBCT, 25th Infantry Division, at Schofield Barracks, HI. There he served as a weapons squad leader, assistant operations sergeant, and rifle platoon sergeant. He deployed to Thailand in support of Operation Cobra Gold 2020 during the onset of the COVID-19 epidemic.

SFC Holomuzki currently serves as the Senior Military Science Instructor at the University of



SFC Holomuzki's military education includes the Senior Leader's Course, Advanced Leader's Course, Warrior Leader's Course, Basic Combative Course, Airborne School, Air Assault School, SHARP Foundation Course, and the Battlefield Forensics Course.


SFC Holomuzki's awards and decorations includes: Army Commendation Medal (5), Army Achievement Medal (5), Meritorious Unit Citation (2), Army Good Conduct Medal (3rd award), National Defense Service Medal, Afghan Campaign Medal (2 Stars), Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, NCO Professional Development Ribbon (Numeral 3), Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon, NATO medal, Basic Parachutist Badge, Air Assault Badge, Combat Infantryman Badge, Expert Infantryman Badge, and German Schutzenschnur (Gold).

SFC Holomuzki holds a bachelor's degree from the Ohio State University in International Security and Intelligence Studies. SFC Holomuzki is married to his wife Sidney, and they have two children, Bo (8) and Laney (4).

THE 2023 CRAMER'S SABERS MILITARY BALL

The 2023 Military Ball took place at the historic Westerly Armory, Westerly Rhode Island, which has been restored to its place as a community icon and now serves as a museum, an event venue, home to The Westerly Band (America's oldest active community band), and largest memorial in Washington County to all veterans. Erected in 1901 after the wood-framed armory on Main Street was destroyed, the Westerly Armory is one of only eighteen historic armories in the state of Rhode Island. It is on the National Register of Historic Places and is also a Save America's Treasures Site, awarded by the United States Congress.



Cramer's Sabers Battalion History

The Army ROTC Battalion on the URI Campus originated from the military training unit established in 1894 by Captain William W. Wetherspoon, later Chief of Staff of the United States Army. Under the provisions of the Morrill Act of 1862, better known as the Land Grand Act, State colleges set up military training units to prepare college students for leadership in the event of a national emergency. In 1920, the unit was re-designated as the Reserve Officers Training Corps in compliance with the National Defense Act of 1920.

Starting with a unit consisting of fourteen men in 1894, the unit grew to approximately 1500 cadets during the time ROTC was mandatory for freshmen and sophomore male students. The unit was organized into a brigade of three battalions consisting of three companies each and one provisional battalion consisting of the junior training company, Kingston Rangers, the ROTC Band and the Drill Team.

An Infantry branch material unit was instituted with military instruction in 1940. Subsequently, Quartermaster and Engineer branch units were incorporated into the program in 1943 and 1951 respectively. Presently, all branch training has been terminated and replaced by general Military Science instruction. (full college credit is received for ROTC courses by all students enrolled.)



THE ARMY ROTC FUND FOR MILITARY LEADERSHIP EXCELLENCE

Under the leadership of the late LTC Paul F Helweg '70, the ROTC Alumni Chapter established The Army ROTC Fund for Military Excellence in 2005. Known as the LTC Richard S Schott Prize, the fund is named for LTC Schott, an outstanding officer who perished in Vietnam while saving his men. The award, consisting of the income generated by the endowment, is given annually to a cadet who demonstrates superior academic, leadership, and other attributes important for a future commissioned officer.

"Through Their Generosity and Dedication, the Following Friends of URI ROTC Continue the Tradition of Leadership Excellence for Our US Army and Our Nation".

The fund initial donors included 40 alumni and friends and is memorialized on a plaque located in the ROTC department. Since 1951, over 11,900 cadets from the program have been awarded commissions into the Active and Reserve Components of the United States Army. Approximately 29,000 students have taken basic ROTC courses at the University of Rhode Island during the same period. Beginning with the academic year 1965-1966, Military Science has been on a voluntary basis. In 1986 the University of Rhode Island cadet battalion was named "CRAMER'S SABERS" in honor of First Lieutenant Parker Dresser Cramer, Infantry Corps, University of Rhode Island Class of 1959.
