- Lisa Giudici, First Year Experience Coordinator
 - EGR 105: Myra in Engineering
 - BUS 101

4 core goals of URI 101

- Explore and identify the URI Community
 - Develop as a learner
 - Utilize platforms (BS, Google, etc)
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- Students can swipe into LLC of their same major residence halls until 8pm
 - Make registration a piece of cake event in LLCs
 - Important to have these other continued conversations related to advising, etc.
 - Connecting with people and growing resources and knowledge even outside of the classroom

- EGR 105
 - Students had less positive experiences with mentors as compared to URI 101
 - Importance of peer-peer roles; mentors should meet 1-on-1 with students between weeks 4-6 because of first bigs assignments and exams during this period; need guidance and support from someone who can relate
 - Would it be possible to have mentors in smaller size classes; class sizes very large; schedule 1 on 1s in class periods?; cole missed many classes during the semester due to projects; professor seemingly forced to teach the class
 - Sometimes less experienced instructors are better than experienced faculty; they may be better at the latter end of learning and degree
 - Professors Contractually obligated to teach URI 101, may believe it is somewhat below their expertise
 - All about showing up the same from the 1st time to the 20th time for example
- Main theme of tools, resources, access, sense of belonging
- Coming in to URI with multiple majors, how are these students considered and would there be resources/help/a section specifically for these individuals
 - Lisa encourages advisors to align with primary major because 2nd and 3rd major are meant to complement primary major
 - Give students curriculum sheets and encourage them to pull up what is needed for major
 - Encourage advising appointment, or to go to outside advising events
- Note that mentors should not have to grade
- If some students aren't willing to share personal information in their reflections, that should be okay
 - Practice empowerment
 - Meant to shape and build life skills
 - We don't expect students to be outed in writing
 - Don't set students up for the potential to feel uncomfortable sharing
- Instructor training
 - Given instructor level access to resources

- Talks about campus resources; customizes to major
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- How to welcome students and build relationships with students
- How to make 50 minutes purposeful every week
- Office hours for faculty to drop in with questions
- Mentor training
 - Finalized application for leadership team today
 - December training continues into spring
 - Will discuss recruitment and sign up day; make it less chaotic

Lisa's changes

- No more transfer specific URI 101 courses!
- Wants URI 102 in spring; caters to non-traditional students
 - Athletes
 - Transfers
 - 1st gens
 - For when non-traditional students are ready
- Achieve all 5 themes of collegiate experience in URI 101
- Programming (meeting with talent development, advising, rhody first, Gender and sexuality center, MSSC, etc.)
- Sections for certain programs/majors/major clusters will run even if there is a small number of students signed up
- Looking for consistency as opposed to standardization; standardization as a whole doesn't cater the same to each major
- Student feedback is the most important thing! Encouragement is needed
