<u>SS- 24/25 - 25 – BILL CALLING FOR THE INSTALLMENT OF A HISTORICALLY</u> <u>EXCLUDED POPULATIONS LIAISON ON THE UNIVERSITY OF RHODE ISLAND</u> <u>STUDENT SENATE</u>

<u>Whereas</u>, Multicultural organizations, including both non-Greek organizations and Black/Hispanic Greek-letter organizations (social and professional), provide critical spaces for cultural expression, leadership development, and academic support for underrepresented student populations, and

<u>Whereas</u>. These organizations enrich campus diversity, promote equity, and foster a sense of belonging among minority students, yet often face challenges in visibility, representation, and engagement within broader campus life, and

<u>Whereas.</u> Students from diverse backgrounds, including those interested in social and professional multicultural Greek-letter organizations, deserve an equitable platform to connect with these opportunities and feel valued as part of the university community, and

<u>Therefore</u>, The creation of a Historically Excluded Populations Liaison within the University of Rhode Island Student Senate will serve to amplify the voices of multicultural student organizations, facilitate collaboration across cultural groups, and advocate for their needs and interests within the larger campus framework, and

<u>Therefore</u>, This liaison will work closely with all multicultural student organizations, including non-Greek entities, social and professional Greek-letter organizations, and chapters, to promote culturally relevant programming, build partnerships, and ensure equitable access to resources and support systems, and

<u>Resolved</u>, That the University of Rhode Island Student Senate establishes a permanent position for a Historically Excluded Populations Liaison, whose responsibilities shall include

but are not limited to:

- 1. Student Outreach: Actively connecting with multicultural organizations to foster collaboration and elevate their presence on campus.
- 2. Event Coordination: Supporting culturally significant programming and promoting diversity-focused events.
- 3. Advocacy: Serving as a voice for multicultural organizations in Student Senate discussions to ensure their concerns and needs are addressed.

4. Partnership Building: Working with university administration, local organizations, and external Greek councils to enhance resources and visibility for multicultural groups.
