K. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

SS-21/22-44 Bill Calling for Amendments to the University of Rhode Island Student Senate Bylaws

<u>Whereas</u>, the University of Rhode Island Student Senate Bylaws currently grants the Chairperson of the Student Organizations Committee the ability to temporarily freeze the accounts of organizations which violate the Senate's financial rules and policies, and

Whereas, the bylaws for the Vice Director of the Treasury also contain text implying that the same power is granted to the Director of the Treasury, and

Whereas, this contradiction must be corrected, now therefore be it,

<u>Resolved</u>, that Article 2, Section 2, Part 1, Line 2.11 be struck from the University of Rhode Island Student Senate Bylaws, and be it further,

<u>Resolved</u>, that the sentence "they may freeze accounts that are in violation of established financial policy by a three-fourths (3/4) vote." be struck from Article 2, Section 9, Part 1, Line 9.03, and be it further,

Resolved, that the sentences "May freeze or suspend any organization's financial accounts on a temporary basis if they are in violation of established financial policies and procedures. This suspension must be reported to the Student Accounts Clerk. Organizations may appeal the suspension to the General Assembly." be added to Article 3, Section 3 of the University of Rhode Island Student Senate Bylaws and designated as Line 3.08 with all lines below being redesignated accordingly.
