URI STUDENT SENATE – GENERAL ASSEMBLY MINUTES April 20, 2022

A. CALL TO ORDER - Speaker Bove called the meeting to order at 6:33pm.

F. PUBLIC FORUM .

Maureen Mcdermott and Will Pipicelli, from WRIU

Delivered presentation about WRIU tower replacement. Explained that the 400 ft broadcast tower was damaged from a hurricane in September of 2021. This tower is important since it provides programs for entertainment such as unique music genres, mens and womens sports teams, and sport talk shows. The bulk of the funding comes from the Student Senate. They are ultimately requesting financial support given the danger it poses to the area. WRIU has collaborated with Capital Project to craft a budget breakdown. They are wishing the Senate to approve a \$500,000 grant from Tax Apportionment by the end of 2022 academic year, as well as the guarantee of the balance of project cost to replace tower, a \$300k,000 loan, thus a total commitment of \$800,000.

Director Hoover: Does this plan include mitigating risk, like for example taking down trees?

Mcdermott: Yes. We got a recommendation that tower we do a solid steel leg tower that provides more stability

Senator Montoya: What took so long to request for financial support?

Pipicelli: Capital projects got new leadership and thus had to review the entire project. It took time to figure out how to go about the issue, and there were more logistical hurdles since URI is a state university.

Senator Bailey: Is there any possibility that you get approved by the Senate but SCC sees that money isn't enough?

Mcdermott: No, if they see progress, they will support us

Senator Breene: Is money you're asking for static? What will happen if the senate approves a lesser amount?

Mcdermott: The money requested is based on what Capital Projects provided minus other expenditures.

Speaker Bove: Regardless of the structure of how the Senate provides money, for example in loans and grants, is the \$800,000 request an all or nothing?

Mcdermott: Yes, they want to know in writing there is approval and support.

President Kiernan: Is Capital Projects the only company you will work with?

Mcdermott: This is their expertise, so yes.

President Kiernan: Is there a possibility that Capital Projects could find contractors that don't cost as much?

Mcdermott: Absolutely.

Senator Newman: On top of funding, will there be a written contractual contingency plan?

Mcdermott: Sure, if it is something that they can accomplish.

Senator Montoya: Has there been vested interest by alums to support this?

Mcdermott: No.

Pipicelli: On the topic of alums, people who listen to the broadcast donate. To answer the question, we are asking donors and the listener base, and we are trying to make sure alums are more aware of our need.

Dr. Bahram Nassersharif: Why build a tower for the future, if the future is the internet, and if times have passed in terms of technology?

Pipicelli: We are fully aware of what is going on. We have listeners all across the country in full support of us. Part of the ability to stream is to broadcast live.

Mcdermott: Towers and live radio are not dying. It still very much exists.

Speaker Bove: If this fails to pass in time, what is the comeback process?

Pipicelli: We won't start the time on that clock until we know the tower is going down.

Mcdermott: Capital Projects needs that tower down for safety reasons. The station would lose its license.

L. NEW BUSINESS SS-22/23-02 Resolution Calling for Improvements to the University of Rhode Island's Shuttle Service

<u>Whereas</u>, the URI shuttles are supposed to be a safe, timely, convenient way to travel between commuter parking lots and residence halls to the university's academic core, and

<u>Whereas</u>, despite this, URI's current shuttle service is extremely slow, with many shuttles often sitting in commuter lots for over ten minutes at a single stop, and

Whereas, for this reason, using the URI shuttles is often more time consuming than simply walking to classes, and

<u>Whereas</u>, these flaws in the shuttle service add to the existing issues of limited parking availability on campus, and discourages students from parking in both Keaney and Plains Road lots, now therefore be it,

<u>Resolved</u>, that the University of Rhode Island Student Senate requests a formal review of the university's current shuttle service, and be it further,

<u>Resolved</u>, that the University of Rhode Island Student Senate requests that changes be made to the shuttle service to improve its timeliness and to heavily reduce the amount of time spent idling in commuter parking lots.

SS-22/23-03 Bill Allocating \$20,000 for Maintenance Projects at the Northwoods Challenge Course

<u>Whereas</u>, these repairs are essential to continuing to offer free services to student organizations now therefore be it,

<u>Resolved.</u> that \$20,000 be immediately allocated to the Northwoods Challenge Course from the Student Senate's Tax Apportionment accounts.
