G. REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

- Student Organization Committee

- Chair Gibson stated that her committee has a bill on the floor to recognize the Pickleball Club, of which First Lady Mary Parlange is an advisor. She then explained the rules for Senate Assassins, which will be starting tomorrow at 12pm. Lastly she urged all senators to participate in a Planned Parenthood phonebank beginning at 5:30pm tomorrow in the Student Senate office.

- Academic Affairs Committee

- Chair Summerson stated that registration for J-term courses opened on Monday, and will remain open until January 1st. She also reported that the universal attendance resolution which was recently passed by the Senate will be discussed by Faculty Senate at their meeting on November 17th.

- External Affairs Committee

SS-22/23-26 Bill Calling for the Allocation of \$3,660 to the Northwoods Challenge Course to Provide for the Completion of Deferred Maintenance Projects

<u>Whereas</u>, on April 20, 2022, the University of Rhode Island Student Senate passed Senate Bill <u>SS-22/23-03</u> which provided for the allocation of \$20,000 from the Student Senate's Tax Apportionment Account to fund repairs and much needed maintenance at the Northwoods Challenge Course, and

Whereas, due to the rising cost of building material being seen across the country, the total cost for the maintenance projects is set to exceed the Senate's original allocation by \$3,660, and

Whereas, it is more cost effective to complete the needed repairs as part of one large project rather than continuing to defer maintenance to keep costs bellow \$20,000, now therefore be it,

<u>Resolved</u>, that an additional allocation shall be made from the Student Senate's Tax Apportionment Accounts to cover the remaining costs of the Northwoods Challenge Course's maintenance project in an amount not to exceed \$3,660.

SS-22/23-27 – BILL CALLING FOR THE ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF "URI Pickleball Club" AS A SENATE-RECOGNIZED ORGANIZATION

SS-22/23/28 Resolution Recommending the Installation Stall Doors in Residence Hall Bathrooms

<u>Whereas</u>, the University of Rhode Island Department of Housing and Residential Life has asked the University of Rhode Island Student Senate for a recommendation on how to provide more bathroom security to address student safety concerns, and

Whereas, the University of Rhode Island Student Senate's Campus Affairs Committee was presented with two viable methods of securing bathrooms, and

Whereas, stall doors which are larger in size reduces the ability of others to reach over or under the door with a camera, and

<u>Whereas</u>, the University of Rhode Island Department of Housing and Residential Life has stated that installing new stall doors on showers and toilets in residence halls across campus would not affect the university's housing costs to students, and

<u>Whereas</u>, students across campus mainly agree that an improved physical barrier such as a large stall door on showers and toilets would make them feel safer, now therefore be it,

<u>Resolved</u>, that the University of Rhode Island Student Senate recommends installing tall stall doors in all residence hall showers and toilet stalls in publicly accessible bathrooms.

SS-22/23-29 Resolution Calling for Dining Services to Revert to the 2021-2022 "Grab'N'Go" Dining System for the 2023-2024 Academic Year

Whereas, the current dining dollars system is extremely unpopular and there have been numerous student and staff complaints about the unnecessary changes to the dining plan system affecting the 2022-2023 academic year, and

Whereas, Grab'N'Go Swipes offered convenient and cost efficient purchase options at various places across campus including Ram's Den and Pizza Express, and

Whereas, the act of phasing Ram Account out and supplementing it with Dining Dollars in the more affordable commuter plans locks student money into the Dining Services Auxiliary, and

<u>Whereas</u>, Ram Account provided off campus options for students who felt that their needs were not accommodated by Dining Services at no additional cost, and

Whereas, now students who have purchased any dining plan apart from the Campus Complete Plan have to pay extra out of pocket to eat off campus when not relying on dining services, and

<u>Whereas</u>, last year University of Rhode Island's Dining Services did not consult the Student Senate, the elected representatives of the student body designated to speak on all students' behalf, in the designing of the meal plans for the 2022-2023 academic year, and

Whereas, last year the University of Rhode Island Student Senate unanimously adopted Senate Resolution **SS-21/22-43**, which officially declared the Student Senate's opposition to the current Dining Plans, and denounced Dining Services for finalizing these plans without consulting the student body's elected representatives, and

<u>Whereas</u>, throughout the course of the current academic year, students have continued to express strong and consistent opposition to the Dining Dollars system, now therefore be it,

<u>Resolved</u>, that the University of Rhode Island Student Senate formally calls upon Dining Services to return to the 2021-2022 academic year meal plans, with price adjustments made to account for inflation and the rising costs of relevant goods needed for dining operations, and be it further,

<u>Resolved</u>, that the University of Rhode Island Student Senate reaffirms it's demand that the student body's elected representatives be consulted before the finalization of dining plans, as well as other important issues affecting students going forward.

Chair Chadronet expressed his support for the bill, and stated that it is important to pass it tonight because we are on a time crunch. He expressed that we must resolve this issue this year as next year's students will not be aware of the issue.

President Kiernan stated that she thinks this resolution is great and stressed its importance.

Vice President Gamache expressed her support for the resolution.

Chair Chadronet motioned to amend the resolution to change "2022-2023" in the first resolved to "2021-2022". Seconded by Chair Gibson.

Chair Tyson asked Chair Chadronet if he would be willing to work with her on a bill to create a new liaison to Dining Services.

Senator Peckham yielded the floor to Director Hoover/

Director Hoover expressed his support for potential legislation creating a dining liaison.

Speaker Bove stated that the position of Dining Services liaison already exists, and that Chair Chadronet merely needs to appoint someone.

Chair Chadronet motioned to call the question. Seconded by Senator Palmer

M. GENERAL DISCUSSION AND OPEN FORUM

Chair Gibson asked if there is anyone in the chamber who wants to participate in Senate Assassins that has not signed up.

Speaker Bove asked the two newly sworn in senators to see him after adjournment.

Senator Bono recognized Chair Chadronet's hard work in getting tonight's resolutions passed.

Senator Mayers stated that he would like to work with the Campus Affairs and External Affairs Committee to create a new Greek Life Liaison.

President Kiernan stated that the position already exists and that she is working with Chair Scotti to find someone to fill it.

Senator Montoya reported that he is moving forward with his life skills training and that he plans to make it a series. He asked anyone who has ideas about skills to cover to reach out to him.

Dr. Stiles listed the following, dining, disability service, gender and sexuality, parking, public safety, wellness, and financial aid, as liaison positions previously created by the Senate.
