Vice-President Feroz Presenting on RhodyShuttle Survey Results

- Survey was aimed to look at how student and faculty felt about the shuttles
- Shuttles directly impact academic affairs, Are students able to get to their class and learn?
- Total number of respondents who took the survey 974
- 53% lived off campus
- 47% live on campus
- This affects campus affairs and external
- 892 respondents were undergraduate students
- Bidirectional shuttles: going one way and anticlockwise, students do want to see this on campus
- Most of the respondents said that they were very satisfied with the shuttle experience and driver courtesy, as well as cleanliness.
