# **E. PUBLIC FORUM**

- Keith Labelle from the iStand program (content may be heavy, trigger warning sexual assault)
  - Most of you have probably heard me speak already
  - I'd like this to be a conversation about how we can help each other and spread these messages
  - I would like to thank your president for helping to spread these messages across campus
  - A few of my students from I-stand are here, including jordan jones the president of I-stand
  - I am going to go through a lot of information but please feel free to stop me with any questions
  - I would like you all to think about how you can spread this around campus, because sexual violence does not discriminate
  - Most people are good and don't condone sexual violence
  - How do we take care of students that have been impacted?
  - New in the legislation: makes sure that students who are parents get the help and childcare they need
  - Very first presentation that I gave I didn't think that anyone would want to talk to me or engage and after that four women came to me
  - More than 50% of sexual violence is committed over the red zone
  - Disproportionately affects women
  - We are going to call the crime what it is: rape
  - Legislation around rape varies across state lines
  - How can we help someone from going from a victim to survivor?
  - Program has been national and internationally recognized, because of the work that our students do
  - Sexual violence against women is not a women's issue it is a people issue, this is not going to be solved at the criminal level. This needs to be solved by people
  - It is important that we are educated about the nuances and how we can help people
  - Important to de-stigmitize sexual violence
  - This isn't a crime that happens monday through friday 8:30 to 4:30, my door is always open
  - In the process of hiring an investigator

- Part of what has been done in the last few years: offender education -> to get them the education that they need
- It's on us (partnered with),
- With a domestic if the police are called there is an automatic restraining order, the person would have to move out, the state of rhode island would take over the case (The state of rhode island V. offender)
- If you take a phone from someone that is trying to call for help that is considered
- Title 9: protects against everyone, women, men, student, staff, faculty
- We always leave it up to the student who was negatively impacted by the situation, and try to find a fit for them
- We have to provide supportive measures: no contact orders, housing relocation, being free from hostile environment
- I want people to see that URI cares, to know how it happens, and be able to take action
- People are a lot more likely to tell other students then they are going to tell a staff members
- The more people we educate the more people will say: "that happened to me too"
- Brianna: I'm a new intern this semester, i took the class this semester, this internship didn't seem optional to me, even just helping one or two people means more than anything. This means more than anything
- Vic: I originally took this class just for credit, but it gave me more than anything I could ask for. I think that we should keep going with this education because it affects everyone here
- Georgia: it is my second year with i-stand. I didn't know much about i-stand but talked to Keith and came out feeling like a better person. I thought that I knew a lot but after taking that class I realized I knew nothing. Nothing seems the same after, I learned and gained so much from this class. If you cna help one person it is worth
- Bella: This is my first year in I-stand. I am actually taking the class and being an intern at the same time. 1-4 women you know have been affected by sexual assault that quote stuck with me
- Collin: I took the class on a whim last semester, and I walked in with zero expectation. I didn't see it at first and now I see it everywhere. I just wanted to be part of the solution

- Our student interns are the reason that we are so successful
- I would love to do an action project with the student senate.
- I am proud to say that I attend a university that would never sweep things under the rug
- We partner with the DVRC and the rhode island coalition against domestic violence
- I-stand featured in forbes magazine
- Men what do you do when you wake up every morning to prevent yourself from being raped? Don't really think about it right
- Women what do you do every day to prevent yourself from being raped?
   Carrying pepper spray, never walking alone, not wearing both headphones when walking at night
- 87% of sexual assault are committed by someone that the women knows
- Blue lights on campus have never been used against a stranger trying to assault someone on campus
- Just-world phenomenon theory that good things happen to good people, a feeling that someone gets that they "deserved" what happened to them
- What happened to you COUNTS?
- 70% of women physically struggle at first and either pretend to be asleep or go to another place
- It is never the victim's fault
- The majority of undetected rapist continue to do it, averaging 6 rapes per offender
- Program currently in the TD house
- 30% of women who were negatively impacted by sexual violence thought about suicide
- Be open to changing your mind!
- Look into this the numbers and the issues
- Desensitized due to hypersexualized medias
- 95% of assaults go unreported
- 1 in5 women get raped in college
- 73 sec american get sexually assaulted
- Women 25% of getting assaulted
- 19 in 20 sexual assault don't get reported, mostly because they feel in some way

- that they are to blame
- First 6 weeks of college mid to late august through thanksgiving are the time that people are most likely to be assaulted; mostly because criminal pray on vulnerable people
- Alcohol is the number one date rape drug because one person takes advantage of another persons incapacitation
- There is either sex or sexual assault no in between
- Consent may be withdrawn at any time
- People leave abusive relationships 7 to 11 times before they leave for good
- The most dangerous time for someone in an abusive relationship is when the person leaves and when the person who is being abused gets pregnant
- A victim may only reach out once. Be patient and believe them
- It is illegal for someone to blackmail another person with videos or photo of sexual naked
- If you videotape someone without their consent or send it without their consent it is Illegal
- Everyone heals in different ways
