- Reminds Senate to "Vote Yes on 2" for the Rhode Island 2024 Election, giving funds to URI.
- Housing Goals: Decrease the amount of 3 student capacity rooms as it turns away prospective students; new apartment complex dorms predicted by Fall 2027.
- Student Affairs: Reminds the Student Senate of prohibited activities, the URI
  Report IT Page, and creates a good image of URI students as student leaders off
  campus.
- Prospective new 15 year campus plan: Asks senators to help identify what they like and don't like around campus for more effective improvements.

# M. NEW BUSINESS

# SS-24/25-04 BILL CALLING FOR THE ALLOCATION OF ADDITIONAL FUNDS FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF THE WRIU BROADCAST TOWER

<u>Whereas</u>, at the start of the 2022-2023 Academic year, the WRIU FM broadcast tower was heavily damaged by Tropical Storm Henry, thus resulting in conditions beyond repair and posing a safety concern for the campus, and

<u>Whereas</u>, Student Senate, under Bill SS-22/23-05, allocated funds for the replacement of the WRIU Broadcast tower in the amount of \$1,117,000, and

<u>Whereas</u>, Student Senate, under Bill SS-24/25-03, granted an anticipated total cost of \$1,200,000 toward the replacement of the WRIU Broadcast tower due to the increased costs of production, delivery of materials, and construction, and be it further that

<u>Whereas</u>, due to the increased project estimate of \$1,550,000, which is reflected by new estimates related to the tower's design and construction, an additional amount of approximately \$350,000 is needed for the project's completion and eligibility to pursue the necessary bidding process, so therefore now be it,

**Resolved**, that the Student Senate further allocate \$350,000 from the Tax Apportionment fund, in the form of a grant, towards the replacement of the WRIU Broadcast tower, with any unused funds being returned to the Student Senate Tax fund.
