SS-23/24-32 RESOLUTION CALLING FOR INCREASED COURSE AVAILABILITY DURING COURSE SELECTION PERIODS

<u>Whereas</u>, students' access to the courses required for their major(s) directly correlates to graduating on time, and

<u>Whereas</u>, required major courses in E-Campus often fill up or close before the course selection period is over, and

<u>Whereas</u>, waitlists are often full and professors cannot grant access to a course where seat capacity has already been reached, and

<u>Whereas</u>, students who work or commute are negatively impacted by the first come first serve class selection policy, now therefore be it,

<u>Resolved</u>, the University of Rhode Island Student Senate formally requests class selection priority be designated to students within the major prior to other students outside of the major. (I.e. Psychology students get first selection of PSY classes before people who are Business, Health Studies majors, etc), and be it further

Resolved, the University of Rhode Island Student Senate suggests that the University of Rhode Island hire more professors for popular majors.

SS-23/24-33 RESOLUTION CALLING FOR UNIVERSITY PROVIDED HIGHER-CAPACITY WIFI AND INTERNET ACCESS

Whereas, students and faculty have been having trouble accessing the internet due to slow wifi, and

<u>Whereas</u>, students' internet access has a direct impact on grades as more and more class content is located online, and

<u>Whereas</u>, students being unable to access academic websites such as TopHat, Edfinity, etc. negatively impacts their attendance and participation grades, and

<u>Whereas</u>, equitable access to education dictates that every student should have the same opportunity as any other student, and the decreased access to WiFi negatively impacts lower-income students that rely on University WiFi to get their work done, and

<u>Whereas</u>, each wifi repeater or extender can only accommodate about 100 students at a time, becoming an issue especially in lectures with over 100 students, now therefore be it

Resolved, the University of Rhode Island Student Senate formally requests that more WiFi routers and/or repeaters be installed in high-traffic areas such as the 24 Hour Room in the Robert L. Carothers Library & Learning Commons, and auditoriums with class capacity of 100 students or above.
