Microsoft Excel:

We will be using Excel to solve certain problems and there will be graded assignments that you will complete in Excel.

Course Description and Learning Outcomes

The primary purpose of the course is the application of accounting principles and objectives of financial reporting in the context of corporate financial statements. The course topics include current and long-term liabilities, bonds, leases, income taxes, stockholders' equity, share-based compensation, earnings per share, accounting changes, and statement of cash flows.

- You will apply knowledge of accounting standards applicable to current and long-term liabilities, equity valuation and reporting, earnings per share, income taxes, leases, accounting changes and preparation of the statement of cash flows to solve problems.
- You will be able to explain full disclosure requirements for the above topics.
- You will demonstrate how to use Excel to solve accounting problems.
- You will apply accounting concepts to current events and engage with other students in discussions on assigned news articles.

Course Format

Brightspace Online Lessons

The online lessons will be delivered through the *Brightspace* platform. Begin at the **START HERE** menu item. The lessons will be broken down by chapter topics and I will have outlines and video problem solving demonstrations posted by topic. You will be responsible for the textbook readings to supplement my online content. We will cover approximately two chapters each week.

Connect Assignments

Twice weekly you will have *Connect* chapter problems and quizzes due that we will review during our WebEx meetings. These are graded assignments.

Chapter Problems: You will be allowed two attempts on each question. Various resources such as hints and textbook references will be available for homework.

Chapter Quizzes: You will also take an online quiz in Connect at the end of each chapter. Quizzes will be available online for ONE DAY ONLY, and only one attempt will be allowed. You will have **one hour** to complete the quiz. Some quiz questions are algorithmic therefore each student will have different values and answers for each question. Scores and feedback will be available one hour after the assignment is due.

All Connect assignments are due at 11:00pm on the due date listed in the course schedule.

Excel Assignments

Brightspace Discussion Forums

Each week you will read an assigned Wall Street Journal Article and participate in the **Brightspace** discussion forums. You will be required to respond to the discussion question and then comment on at least two peers' responses. Your own responses must be well thought out and written. Your comments peers must also be substantive. Comments like "I agree with you Jim" or "Great point, Natalie" do not count as participation. You need to explain why or why not you agree or disagree. Or you might add on to their response with your own thoughts.

WebEx Meeting Participation

I will hold weekly WebEx meetings (lasting no more than one hour) to review and answer questions on the topics that you have covered since the last meeting. The meetings will be held every Monday and Thursday at 9:00am and 6:00pm to accommodate students' schedules. You must attend one of the meetings each Monday and Thursday, but you can choose which time you attend. I will allow one absent without reducing credit.

Exams

There will be three non-cumulative exams that will be administered through **Brightspace**. The exams will be open for 48 hours and you will have 2 hours to complete each exam. Initial scores will only reflect auto-graded questions such as multiple choice. Once I have completed the manually graded questions, your scores will be updated.

Course Policies

Instructor Goals

My goal is to assist you in learning the course material. I will be fair and consistent in enforcing my policies with each student. Most importantly, I will treat each student with respect and I will expect the same in return.

Due dates:

I will only give extensions on assignments with a documented reason why you unable to meet the due date. This is also applies to exams. Not knowing an assignment was due, is not a valid reason. You have a detailed schedule of all assignments, quizzes and exams with due dates.

- Submitting the same paper for more than one course without prior approval from the instructors.
