DIRECTOR'S NOTES

How will we storytellers keep theatre alive in this era of shorter attention spans, and audiences accustomed to instant gratification? Playwright Kate Hamill invites us to experience an exciting answer to that question. The answer is joy: which I believe is one of the most innate of human experiences. Hamill's *Pride & Prejudice* allows us to see Jane Austen's beloved story with fresh eyes, and ample laughs. Jane Austen (1775-1817) was a writer, like few before or since, who was able to tap into a timeless understanding of humanity. She illuminates the nature of love, family, and how our more sinister proclivities so often get in our own way. In this production, we've attempted to amplify the story's ability to transcend time, through Hamill's use of anachronism, and with a variety of design choices, and a range of dance styles. By turning the Regency Era a bit on its head, we are hopefully able to shorten the distance between the characters on stage, and ourselves. I want people to have fun watching this play, to laugh, and to feel empowered (especially the women and girls in the audience). I hope everyone leaves the theater feeling like a bolder, brighter, and more alive version of themselves. Aside from the infectious silliness, I also hope this production strikes a deeper chord in audiences. Austen reminds us that a combination of humility and compassion is always the path best taken, no matter how alluring judgement and superiority can seem. In a society where division and righteousness abound, this is a worthwhile message. Our main characters in *Pride & Prejudice* find that perhaps some traditions are worth keeping, but within them, one can forge a path of one's own.
