- (1) SA must be equal or greater than 40%
- (2) The sum of SA + PA + SP must be 60%
- (3) The sum of SA + PA + SP + IP must be 90%

The College adopted the ABDC ranking as the base for measuring quality of publication. The ABDC listing is not restrictive and nor exhaustive. Journals not listed in ABDC can be accepted. However, it is the responsibility of the Author to provide data to support the quality of the journal. A committee of the faculty will review and vote whether to accept or reject inclusion of the journal. Thus, it is strongly recommended that Authors submit their request to the committee as soon as they consider a journal that is not included in the ABDC list.

Scholarly Academics

The Scholarly Academics (SA) status is granted to newly hired faculty members who earned their research doctorates from an AACSB accredited program within the last five years prior to the review dates. COB PhD students who have passed comprehensive exams will be considered as having SA status. Newly hired faculty with ABD status will be considered as having SA status for the first two years. Individuals with a graduate degree in law will be considered SA if their appointment occurs within one year of graduation of either a JD or MLL degree and they teach law classes. Subsequent to hiring, SA status is sustained through publishing two top tier (A or A* based on ABDC ranking) peer reviewed journal articles within a five-year period, or through publishing one peer reviewed journal article from the ABDC list and significant (50% or more) administrative activity by appointment (e.g. Dean, Associate Dean). A funded grant from a reputable outside source such as NSF or NIH will count as one top tire Journal publication.

Faculty who are teaching doctoral seminars must:

- 1. have published three peer reviewed, full-length journal articles, or
- 2. have published two peer reviewed, full-length journal articles and served on academic editorial board
- 3. have published two peer reviewed, full-length journal articles and held significant administrative appointments
- 4. at least one of the published articles must be considered discovery based research

Practice Academics

The Practice Academics (PA) status is granted to faculty with research doctorates who sustain currency and relevance through a significant level of professional engagement, interaction, and relevant activities, such as the activities listed below, or some combination of academic (as included in the definition of SA) and professional engagement. PA status applied to faculty members who augment their initial preparation as academic scholars with activities that demonstrate on-going engagement with the business and/or non-profit community, including social entrepreneurial organizations, and other community related agencies. PA status is sustained as outlined below.

Faculty may undertake a variety of scholarly and/or professional engagement activities to interact with business and management practice and maintain their PA status. In addition, significant administrative service to the college or university (dean, associate dean, area coordinator – our version of department chair, president of the union) may be considered evidence of professional qualification, per the AACSB 2013 Standards (p. 42).

Professional engagement activities include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Publication of textbooks or trade books (2 points)
- Publication of textbook or trade book chapters (1 point)
- Publication of practitioner journal articles (1 point)
- Publication of papers in conference proceedings (1 point)
- Publication of book reviews (0.5 points)
- Editorship of academic or practitioner journals (2 points)
- PI for a funded grant from recognized and reputable organizations such as NSF and NIH (3 points)
- Co-PI for funded grant from recognized and reputable organizations such as NSF and NIH (2 points)
- Regularly published other media content (e.g. columns, blog, television) (1 point)
- Consulting activities that are material in terms of time and substance (as approved by Area Coordinator; maximum 1 point per year)
- PI for a funded grant from recognized and reputable organizations such as NSF and NIH (3 points)
- Co-PI for funded grant from recognized and reputable organizations such as NSF and NIH (2 points)
- Keynote speaking engagements (1 point)
- Expert witness activities in field of expertise (1 point)
- Faculty internships (2 points)
- Development and presentation of executive education programs (1 point)
- Sustained professional work related to discipline (as approved by Area Coordinator and the Dean or designated individual; maximum 1 point per year)
- Significant leadership role in an academic or business professional association (1 point)
- Relevant, active service on boards of directors (2 points)

- Documented continuing professional education experiences (0.5 points)
- Participation in professional events that focus on business/management (0.25 points)
- Writing grant proposals to secure grants to fund economic or research activities (0.25 points)
- Participation in other activities that place faculty in direct contact with business or other organizational leaders (0.5 points)
- Continuous evidence of intellectual contribution (1 point)
- Significant administrative academic service (2 points)
- Practice-oriented intellectual contributions (1 point)
- Instructional case development (1 point)

To be categorized as a Practice Academic, the faculty member should generate ten points each five year, rolling period. Per AACSB 2013 Standards, Area Coordinators who are no longer SA may be designated PA throughout their tenure as Area Coordinator, and will be designated PA for an additional two years after stepping down from this role so they have sufficient time to reinvigorate their research programs. Administrators (such as Vice Provost, Dean, Associate Dean) who return to their home areas will be designated PA for the five years after they resume their positions as faculty, or until they regain SA status, assuming a minimum of one year in the administrative role.

Scholarly Practitioners

Scholarly Practitioners sustain currency and relevance through continued professional experience, engagement, or interaction and scholarship related to their professional background and experience. Normally, SP status applies to practitioner faculty members who have a master degree in the relevant field of teaching and augment their experience with development and engagement activities involving substantive scholarly activities in their fields of teaching. To meet the college mission, SP status is sustained as outlined below. Faculty who have earned a master degree in the field they teach, or earned doctorates from non-AACSB programs or research doctorates in other disciplines (e.g. education, humanities, engineering) in the last five years are granted SP status.

For sustained SP status, a non-exhaustive list of academic and professional engagement activities may include the following:

- Relevant peer-reviewed journal publications (2 points)
- Publication of practitioner journal articles (1 point)
- Research reports for state and regional governmental agencies (2 points)
- Published conference proceedings (1 point)
- Paper presentations at academic conferences (0.5 points)
- PI for a funded grant from recognized and reputable organizations such as NSF and NIH (3 points)
- Co-PI for funded grant from recognized and reputable organizations such as NSF and NIH (2 points)
- Instructional case development (1 point)
- Service on committees (0.5 points)
- Publication of textbook, trade book, or monograph (2 points)
- Publication of textbook or trade book chapters (1 point)
- Publication of book reviews (0.5 points)
- Regularly published other media content (e.g. newspaper columns, blog, television) (1 point)
- Writing grant proposals to secure grants to fund economic or research activities (0.25 points)
- Leadership positions in recognized academic societies (1 point)
- Research awards (1 point)
- Keynote speaking engagements (1 point)
- Invited presentations (0.5 points)
- Presentation of papers at practitioner-oriented societies and conferences (1 point)
- Development and presentation of continuing professional education activities or executive education programs (1 point)
- Substantive roles and participation in academic associations or professional societies/trade organizations (1 point)
- Expert witness activities in field of expertise (1 point)
- Service on boards of directors of notable business or not-for-profit agencies (2 points)

Point values are per item or per academic year. To be categorized as a Scholarly Practitioner, the faculty member should generate ten points each five year, rolling period. Professional activities are expected to primarily focus on contributions to the practice of their discipline and on the transfer of knowledge to students and practitioners that improves managerial efficiency and effectiveness.

Instructional Practitioners

Instructional Practitioners (IP) are expected to regularly engage in professional activities that will enhance the currency and depth of their knowledge in order to improve the educational mission of their institution and the practice of their chosen profession. Normally, IP status is granted to newly hired faculty members who join the faculty with significant and substantive professional experience and teach in the area of their expertise. For sustained IP status, the faculty member should engage in activities that include, but are not limited to:

- Full time employment professionals in their respective fields (for per course instructors only; full time faculty are not eligible for full time employment in their respective fields) (Eight points, 8 point maximum for rolling, 5 year period)
- Sustained professional work (15-30 hours/week) related to discipline (as approved by Area Coordinator and the Dean or designated individual; 2 points per year, 8 point maximum for rolling, 5 year period)
- Participation in professional events that focus on the practice of business, management, and related issues (0.5 points)
- Expert witness activities in their fields of expertise (1 point)
- Consulting activities that are material in terms of time and substance (as approved by Area Coordinator; maximum 1 point per year)
- Faculty Externships (2 points)
- PI for a funded grant from recognized and reputable organizations such as NSF and NIH (3 points)
- Co-PI for funded grant from recognized and reputable organizations such as NSF and NIH (2 points)
- Development and presentation of executive education programs (1 point)
- Significant participation in business professional associations and societies (1 point)
- Relevant, active service on boards of directors (2 points)
- Documented continuing professional education experiences (0.5 points)
- Documented professional certifications in the area of teaching (2 points)
- Attendance at professional/industry workshops or seminars relevant to teaching (0.25 points)
- Participation in other activities that place faculty in direct contact with business and other organizational leaders (0.5 points)

Point values are per item or per academic year. To be categorized as an Instructional Practitioner, the faculty member should generate ten points each five year, rolling period.
