





HOW DRUGS ARE DISCOVERED

The class begins on Thursday, Oct 8, at 4pm, 4 Sessions, \$40

The evolution of drug discovery will be discussed beginning with the limited knowledge in ancient times to today where advances in chemistry, biology, and biotechnology provide new and ever evolving advances. Topics discussed will include the discovery of anesthetics and antibiotics, finding and validating new drug targets, finding and optimizing potential new drug molecules. Deep-



er discussions will include developing structure—activity relationships, computer -assisted drug design, and the various roles in drug discovery.

Instructor: JOHN JA-

NUSZ received his B.S. in chemistry from Providence College and his Ph.D. from Yale University in organic chemistry. He has been pursuing the topic of drug discovery ever since. Active in the American Chemical Society, he is currently an Adjunct Professor of Chemistry at the University of Cincinnati and Xavier University. He is the co-author of over fifty publications and patents.
