## Rhode Island: Vampire Capital of America

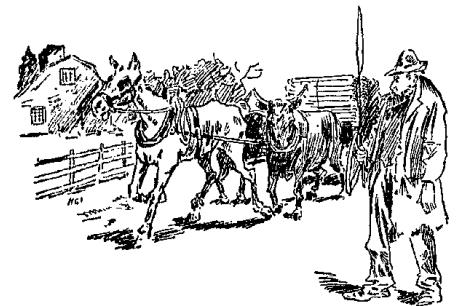

Google Drive, Google Docs, Google Sheets, and Google Slides—is accessible wherever there is an internet connection. With these tools, you can set up and organize your Google Drive with folders. With Google Docs, you create, format, and save your documents. We will cover the basics of spreadsheets with Google Sheets and create a slide presentation with Google Slides.

**Before the first class:** On your own device, using an internet browser (Chrome, Edge, Safari) go to Google.com. Then either create a Google account or sign in to your Google account. Using either the Google Playstore or the App Store on an Apple device, download the app for the day. Assistance will be available 30 minutes before class to help with downloading an app or setting up your screen.
