- How to Assess the Impact of Existing International Engineering Programs
  Addresses how we assess the success and impact of existing international
  engineering programs, and how we measure what impact the study or
  internship abroad experience has had on the life and professional development of a participant.

I would like to thank our Steering Committee and Colloquium sponsors for their great support in organizing the colloquium, and wish you two and a half days of inspiring exchanges and networking!
