SPANISH IEP (Track B) - Entering Fall 2022

The BA program in Spanish requires a minimum of 30 credits at the 103 level or above, at least one 300-level course in language and linguistics (SPA 312, 313, or 321), at least one 300-level course in literature (SPA 305, 306, 307, 308 or 325), and at least three courses at the 400-level. We recommend taking SPA 325 (it is a prerequisite for most of the SPA 400-level courses) and you must take SPA 321 before going abroad in the 4th year (SPA 321 is a prerequisite for SPA 316-317 –your internship). It is strongly recommended that you take a SPA class each semester. Please make an appointment with your Spanish IEP Advisor to discuss your individual schedule ahead of each new semester and, if needed, to discuss supplemental language opportunities (ie. tutoring, summer courses). If you start at the SPA 104 level and have taken 3 years of Spanish or more during HS, you might be able to receive 3 credits of SPA toward your Spanish major (https://bit.ly/urilanginccred).

Courses marked with an asterisk (*) throughout this guide are not required, however are strongly recommended.

Please note you will need to pay a "credit overload" fee for each credit enrolled above 19 in any given semester (and need permission from your Dean's Office to do so). Summer and winter coursework similarly incur additional costs beyond your fall and spring semester tuition.

General Education Outcomes should be completed as soon as possible. SPA 103-207 cover outcomes *A3* and *C2*, and SPA 321 covers outcomes *B2* and *D1*. *For Heritage Speakers only:* SPA 210 will cover outcomes *A3* and *C3*.

Preapproved Engineering Curriculum Adjustments:

Do not deter from the prescribed engineering curriculum sheet you are following unless confirmed with your engineering advisor. The following approved adjustments correspond to the engineering-specific curriculum sheet you are following:

Chemical Engineering: ECN 201 should most easily fit in the Sophomore Year Fall semester (although can be taken in any Fall or Spring semester, and is normally offered in the Summer).

Civil Engineering: STA 409 should be attempted in the Junior Year Spring semester (seek to complete 1 Professional Elective during your year abroad or during a Summer or Winter term at URI). CVE 355 can be taken in the Senior Year Fall Semester (your 5th year, after you return from your year abroad).

Computer Engineering: MTH 215 can be attempted in Sophomore or Junior year Spring (and is normally offered in the Fall and Summer)

Industrial and Systems Engineering: enroll in MCE 201 in the Sophomore Year Fall Semester and ISE 240/241 in the Sophomore Year Spring Semester
