

Required Tests for URI Teacher Education Students

For fall 2014-spring 2015 student teachers, and after**

AFTER ADMISSION:

All students must take and pass licensure tests PRIOR TO student teaching or final internship, as listed in table below. In order to assure that you will attain required scores, you must choose *early test dates* so that you will have ample opportunity to retake tests if needed. You will not be cleared for student teaching without passing scores.

Information about ETS Registration, Accommodations, and Test Scores

REGISTRATION:

You may already have a 'My Praxis' account—if not, you will need to create one; sign in with your user name and password.

Please designate URI as a score recipient using this code: **3919**

Computer-based tests only: Visit <http://www.ets.org/praxis/register/computer>.
(Paper-based tests were discontinued as of summer 2014.)

At this time, all tests require registration during 'testing windows'. You *may* register for test dates in consecutive testing windows. Some tests offer a testing window each month; those in areas that have fewer test takers (e.g. physics) are not offered as frequently—so you will need to plan accordingly. TESTING ACCOMODATIONS:

- a) **For Test-Takers with Disabilities and Health-related Needs:**
If you have a documented disability through Disabilities Services here at URI, you may qualify for testing accommodations. Preparation (cont.)

Principles of Learning & Teaching (required for many education students): For the PLT K-6 (5622) and PLT 7-12 (5624), EDC 312 or 512 – Psychology of Learning--provides a strong foundation. You may still have the text/notes from that class; these will be a helpful review tool. TEST SCORES:

For tests that are *multiple-choice only*, test score will appear on the screen on test day; your official score report should be available through your ETS account about 12 business days *AFTER* the testing window closes. For tests that include written responses, you will not see your test score until your official score report posts: about 17 business days *AFTER* testing window closes.

ETS Fee Waiver Policy

Important: To be considered for an ETS fee waiver, documentation must be received well ahead of test date. Fee waivers are granted on a first-come, first-served basis, and only given out one time per year to a given student. For example, to be considered for a fee waiver for tests taken between July and September 2014, you must submit documentation by May 21, 2014—but the sooner the better!
