- 4. Reports of Standing Committees:
  - a) Curriculum Committee: The Curriculum Committee report was given by Prof. Cathy English. Te report of the Curriculum Committee is presented in Appendix I.
  - b) Research Committee: There was no report from the Research Committee
  - c) Associate Dean Sheely gave the report on the Cooperative Extension and Outreach Coordinating Committee. The effort to engage in Strategic Planning for all of RI Cooperation is underway with meetings to be held through the summer.
  - d) Professor Lane provided a brief report of the Space Committee activities over the last year.
  - e) Professor Mallilo provided the report of the Commencement Committee. The committee had been working diligently on preparations for the May 16 Graduate Student Ceremony and for the May 17 Undergraduate Ceremony. Details of his report are in Appendix II of these Minutes. Professor Mallilo expressed a need for additional Faculty Marshals at Graduation and urged any faculty member willing to serve as a marshal to contact him or any of the other members of the committee.
  - f) Ms. Fontes-Barros presented the report of the Diversity Committee. She reported the development of a guide for processed developed by the committee. She discussed the new CELS Seeds of Success (SOS) Program for under represented students in the College (<a href="http://web.uri.edu/cels/seeds-of-success/">http://web.uri.edu/cels/seeds-of-success/</a>), and the new Science and Engineering Fellows Program, jointly developed by CELS and the College of Engineering (<a href="http://web.uri.edu/cels/science-and-engineering-fellows/">http://web.uri.edu/cels/science-and-engineering-fellows/</a>). These two new initiatives are expected

- to increase both recruitment and retention of students from under represented backgrounds and there is some indication of initial success.
- g) Professor Lane presented the report of the Bylaws and Review Committee. There was a proposal from the Executive Council to amend the bylaws to reduce the number of members on CELS Committees due to lack of numbers of faculty embers interested in serving. The proposed bylaws changes as communicated from the Executive Council are as follows:

Art Gold (Marian Goldsmith seconded) moves that the Executive Council pass the following changes to the CELS bylaws: Additions are highlighted in yellow. Deletions are denoted by strikethrough. *Note: Section 11.1.2 applies to the Curriculum Committee:* 

11.1.2 Members. There shall be four (4) members a representative of each Department on the committee. Terms will be consistent with the language for the rest of CELS committees per Section 9 of these bylaws. The Associate Dean for Academic Affairs shall serve as an ex officio member of this Committee.

11.2.2 Members. The Research Committee shall be composed of three (3) seven (7) Faculty members and shall be maintained with nominees selected by the departments and appointment made by the dean. Terms will be consistent with the language for the rest of CELS committees per Section 9 of these bylaws. The Associate Dean for Research shall serve ex officio.

11.4.2 Members. The space committee shall be composed of four (4) seven (7) Faculty members and shall be maintained with nominees selected by the departments and elected by the college. Terms will be consistent with the language for the rest of CELS committees per Section 9 of these bylaws. The Associate Dean for Research and Outreach shall serve in an ex-officio capacity and shall be responsible for maintaining the space inventory database on behalf of the Space Committee.

Considerable discussion ensued. Concern was expressed that there may not be sufficient departmental representation on critical committees such as the CELS Curriculum Committee and the Space Committee.

There was a motion by Professor Sullivan, seconded by Professor Maynard to table the motion and hold for further study by the Bylaws Committee. The motion passed unanimously.

- -Veterans-Will be asked to stand up to be recognized for their achievement. Name, major, branch of service, rank and tour of duty will be mentioned.


#### Awarding of Degrees
