OVERVIEW Preparing for URI's Future

THE UNIVERSITY OF RHODE ISLAND

The University of Rhode Island is the state's flagship research university and the state's leading public institution of higher education.

As a land and sea grant institution with global reach, the University of Rhode Island carries out its mission for the benefit of the people of Rhode Island, the United States, and the world. In all aspects of its work, the University of Rhode Island maintains unshakable commitments to academic freedom and expression, shared governance, diversity and inclusion, and active outreach to its many communities of interest. The University of Rhode Island also develops and maintains partnerships for mutual benefit with Rhode Island College, the Community College of Rhode Island, and other private higher education institutions.

THE UNIVERSITY OF RHODE ISLAND BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Board of Trustees is the University's governing body charged with oversight of critical academic and administrative issues, including appointing the University president, annually setting tuition rates, approving the budget, awarding degrees, and formally approving the awarding of tenure to faculty.



BOARD OF TRUSTEES HIGHLIGHTS

New University President

The selection process for the new University president was global, comprehensive, rigorous, and inclusive, involving every facet of the University community. The board organized town hall meetings with all University stakeholders and virtual open forums with presidential candidates. It conducted a totally virtual search and selected the 12th president of the University.

The board is proud of the open and thorough process that led to the hiring of President Marc Parlange, who has already begun strengthening and expanding the University's research mission, including a University-wide call to develop a culture of scholarship and service, which will improve collaboration and communication across colleges, disciplines, and departments. Even though he is in his early days as president, President Parlange is focusing on expanding URI's strengths in oceanography, agriculture, engineering, and the arts, along with the importance of student athletes. He is expected to deliver a new strategic plan in 2022 that will outline the University's vision over the next several years, which will be shared with you and Rhode Island leaders.

COVID-19 Operations and Response

As with other public boards, our work was conducted remotely and in accordance with executive orders during the pandemic. At every meeting, the trustees reviewed the University's response to the pandemic and supported its actions to ensure the health and safety of students, staff, faculty, and visitors to campus. The board praised the entire University community for its outstanding efforts during the pandemic, resulting in 95 percent vaccination rate and a continued very low positivity rate. Importantly, the University was able to manage its financial resources quite effectively throughout the crisis, and, unlike many other higher education institutions, URI has come through the pandemic quite well.



Ten-Year Strategic Plan

The University will engage the entire community and key constituencies in the development of a new University-wide, 10-year strategic plan (2022–2032) designed to create a vision for the future and what the University aspires to achieve. A University-wide Steering Committee will oversee the process, develop key performance indicators (KPIs) to measure progress of the goals, and analyze trends, challenges, and opportunities impacting the higher education landscape currently and into the future.

Social Justice, Equity, and Inclusion at URI

The board is keenly interested in the advancement of social justice, equity, and inclusion at URI. In October 2020, the board heard from University leaders on one of URI's transformational goals for the 21st century—to build a community that values and embraces equity and diversity. At its January, June, and November board meetings, discussions focused specifically on this issue and how to continue to improve the environment at URI. At its November 2021 meeting, the board reviewed the results of the "University of Rhode Island Assessment of Climate for Learning, Living, and Working," URI's first Campus Climate Survey conducted in spring 2021. The report provides baseline data on diversity and inclusion and may be used to guide decision-making regarding policies and practices at URI to realize its commitment to an inclusive campus and to institute organizational structures that respond to the needs of its dynamic campus community.

Rhode Island's Blue Economy

The Board of Trustees sees tremendous opportunity in marshalling the research and economic development engines of the University to help drive and grow the Rhode Island economy.

URI has been especially engaged in providing the scientific and technical basis for renewable energy, fisheries and aquaculture, environmental quality, marine and coastal conservation, and management efforts in conjunction with stakeholders and Rhode Island government agencies. The University and the state of Rhode Island are investing millions of dollars in improvements at the Narragansett Bay Campus, home to URI's world-renowned Graduate School of Oceanography, to advance its efforts in ocean science.

Rhode Island Workforce Efforts

The board is focused on the University's investment in workforce development opportunities, including continuing education/certificate programs, professional development, the URI Online degree program, and 24/7 learning opportunities. Polaris MEP, a business unit of the URI Research Foundation, is a manufacturing industry partner for the Governor's Workforce Board providing competitive manufacturing business improvement programs to grow the state's manufacturing industry. Innovate@URI helps entrepreneurs and startups access the vast resources of the University to help grow their ideas and their business, with URI's Business Engagement Center serving as the front door to industry since 2013.

Charles J. Fogarty, M.P.A. '80, is a native Rhode Islander with a long history of public service. Following eight years as a member of the Rhode Island state Senate, he was elected lieutenant governor and served in that position from 1999-2007. In 2006, he was the Democratic nominee for governor. In addition to elective office, Fogarty has also served as a cabinet member in the administrations of two Rhode Island governors, first as director of the Department of Labor and Training and later as director of elderly affairs. Currently an adjunct professor in the College of Arts and Sciences at Johnson & Wales University, he teaches courses in American government, global ethics, and leadership

Christine Heenan is senior partner and chief communications officer for Cambridge-based Flagship Pioneering, a life sciences platform company, and the founder of Clarendon Group, a communications strategy and social impact consulting firm. She previously served as senior vice president for global policy and advocacy at the Rockefeller Foundation, senior advisor at the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and vice president of public affairs and communications for Harvard University. Heenan was a White House senior policy analyst and speechwriter for President Bill Clinton, focused primarily on health-care policy and women's empowerment. She has taught at Brown University and Harvard College and served as a fellow at the Harvard Kennedy School's Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs and an executive fellow at Harvard Business School. In addition to the URI board, she serves on the board of the David Rockefeller Fund, a New York-based philanthropic foundation.

Cornelius "Neil" Kerwin, M.A. '73, is president emeritus and a professor in the Department of Public Administration and Policy of the School of Public Affairs of American University. He received degrees from American University (B.A.), the University of Rhode Island (M.A., political science), and Johns Hopkins University (Ph.D., political science). He served as dean of American University's School of Public Affairs from 1988-1997, provost from 1997-

2005, and acting president and then president of the university from 2005-2017 when he stepped down and returned to the faculty. A nationally recognized specialist in public policy and the regulatory process, Kerwin is actively engaged in research and periodically teaches courses in administrative process, policy implementation, and American government. He founded AU's Center for the Study of Rulemaking and is the original author and now co-author of Rulemaking: How Government Agencies Write Law

and Make Policy, now in its

fifth edition.
