The Secondary Education program outlined in the table below offers a BA from the College of Education and Professional Studies with a double major in the College of Arts and Sciences (A&S) or the College of Environmental and Life Sciences (CELS). The A&S and CELS major requires a minimum of 30 credit hours. Majors are available in following areas of teacher certification: **Biology, Chemistry, English, French, German, History/Social Studies, Italian, Latin, Mathematics, Physics, and Spanish**. Certification is also available in **General Science**. All prospective Secondary Education students should apply to the School of Education during the spring semester of Year 2. Applications are due annually in January. Applicants **must** have a minimum **cumulative G.P.A. of 2.75**, as well as a **2.5 G.P.A. in their A&S or CELS major**. A test of academic skills prior to admission is required, unless met by other criteria. Academic advising is available in University College prior to admission for both the Secondary Education major and the A&S or CELS major. Upon acceptance, students will be assigned a Secondary Education advisor in the School of Education and students will be assigned an A&S or CELS major advisor in the department of that major.

Starting in Year 3, Education courses are offered only in the semesters indicated. Students who must miss a semester, e.g. to study abroad, should meet with their School of Education advisor as early as possible to determine how to complete the required course sequence, e.g. by taking summer courses.

General Education Requirements

GENERAL EDUCATION GUIDELINES: General education is 40 credits. Each of the twelve outcomes (A1-D1) must be met by at least 3 credits. A single course may meet more than one outcome, but cannot be double counted towards the 40-credit total. At least one course must be a Grand Challenge (G). No more than twelve credits can have the same course code (note- HPR courses may have more than 12 credits). General education courses may also be used to meet requirements of the major or minor when appropriate.
