

ABOUT THE ART HISTORY DEGREE:

The BA program in Art History offers a thorough introduction to the art and architecture of Europe and the Americas from ancient times to the present. Students learn about the major monuments from the history of painting, sculpture, architecture, printmaking, and photography by studying them in their historical, social, and cultural contexts. Visiting artists, scholars, and curators enrich the regular course offerings with special lectures, workshops, and other events.

It is recommended that students who expect to pursue graduate studies in Art History take ART 469 or 470.

It is also recommended that students majoring in Art History achieve intermediate-level proficiency in at least one foreign language. Students anticipating graduate study in Art History may need proficiency in a second foreign language. Students are also encouraged to enroll in courses in Art Studio, History, Literature, Music, and Philosophy.

Please note: Both major and cumulative GPA must be 2.00 or higher in order to graduate.

GENERAL EDUCATION GUIDELINES: General education is 40 credits. Each of the twelve outcomes (A1-D1) must be met by at least 3 credits. A single course may meet more than one outcome, but cannot be double counted towards the 40 credit total. At least one course must be a Grand Challenge (G). No more than twelve credits can have the same course code (note- HPR courses may have more than 12 credits). General education courses may also be used to meet requirements of the major or minor when appropriate.
