ABOUT THE CHINESE DEGREE:

The BA program in Chinese allows students to major, minor, or enroll in dual degree programs, like the International Business or Engineering Program (IBP or IEP); or combine with another major such as Political Science, English, Economics, Fashion Merchandising, or Journalism. The Chinese Language Flagship Program is an honors program designed to help students from any major achieve superior fluency through a five-year plan. Students may participate in exchange programs and summer intensive programs to gain Chinese proficiency.

GENERAL EDUCATION GUIDELINES: General education is 40 credits. Each of the twelve outcomes (A1-D1) must be met by at least 3 credits. A single course may meet more than one outcome, but cannot be double counted towards the 40 credit total. At least one course must be a Grand Challenge (G). No more than twelve credits can have the same course code (note- HPR courses may have more than 12 credits). General education courses may also be used to meet requirements of the major or minor when appropriate.
