#### **ABOUT THE CHINESE DEGREE:**

The BA program in Chinese allows students to major, minor, or enroll in dual degree programs, like the International Business or Engineering Program (IBP or IEP); or combine with another major such as Political Science, English, Economics, Fashion Merchandising, or Journalism. The Chinese Language Flagship Program is an honors program designed to help students from any major achieve superior fluency through a five-year plan.
