## **EDUCATION PROGRAM**

<u>After Admission only (Sequential)</u> - In program sem. 2, 3 and 4, candidates are assigned to <u>cohorts</u>. This determines the section students will enroll in for each of their courses. Each semester requires a <u>practicum</u>. We assign placements. Keep a morning free in sem. 1 and 2, and keep one full day free in sem. 3. Complete your second major & general education courses by sem. 3.

<u>Required Certification Tests</u>-take and pass before sem. 3 (fall senior year) and provide scores to the Office of Teacher Education (701 Chafee) by September 1<sup>st</sup>.
