The Secondary Education program outlined in the table below offers a BA from the College of Human Science and Services with a double major in the College of Arts and Sciences (A&S). The A&S major requires a minimum of 30 credit hours. Majors are available in the following areas of teacher certification: **Biology, Chemistry, Chinese, English, French, German, History/Social Studies, Italian, Latin, Mathematics, Physics,** and **Spanish.** Certification is also available in **General Science**. All prospective Secondary Education students should apply to the School of Education during the spring semester of Year 2. Applications are due annually in January. Applicants **must** have a minimum **cumulative G.P.A. of 2.5**, as well as a **2.5 G.P.A. in the A&S major**. A test of academic skills prior to admission is required, unless met by other criteria. Academic advising is available in University College prior to admission for both the Secondary Education major and the A&S major. Upon acceptance, students will be assigned a Secondary Education advisor in the School of Education and students will be assigned an A&S major advisor in the department of that major.
