FACE COVERINGS (MASKS)

Updated 3/15/2022

Regardless of vaccination status, **face coverings are now optional on all areas of URI's campuses except indoor locations where direct academic instruction or research is taking place** and certain other locations such as healthcare facilities and campus transportation. DAILY SELF-ASSESSMENT

Updated 5/24/2021

The University has **paused use the electronic daily self-assessment app for COVID-19**. However, all students, employees, and visitors coming to any University of Rhode Island campus are still expected to self-monitor for symptoms of COVID-19 and may not come to campus if sick/symptomatic. EVENTS, MEETINGS, GATHERINGS

Updated 7/1/2021

Individuals attending **Campus Events are strongly encouraged to be Fully Up to Date with Vaccination or have a recent negative test for COVID-19**. Events with more than 15 people must be submitted to URI COVID-19 Task Force; events with more than 50 people require review and approval by Task Force. TESTING

Updated 7/1/2022

Students have access to testing at Health Services if they are **symptomatic, exposed, or advised by a healthcare provider to obtain testing**. All others should obtain testing by contacting their primary healthcare provider, urgent clinic, or by visiting one of the community testing centers if they are symptomatic or have been exposed. VACCINE

Updated 7/1/2022

All members of the campus community are **strongly encouraged to be Fully Up to Date with Vaccination or have a recent negative test for COVID-19**. Students and employees are also encouraged to upload documentation of vaccination to the Health Services portal. See <https://web.uri.edu/emergency/files/Vaccination.pdf> for more information.



QUARANTINE

Updated 1/14/2022

Individuals fully up to date on vaccine no longer required to quarantine following a known exposure but **must continue to self-monitor for symptoms**. Unvaccinated individuals must follow state and university quarantine requirements. See <https://web.uri.edu/emergency/files/Isolation-Quarantine.pdf>.



ISOLATION

Updated 1/14/2022

If positive for COVID-19, **minimum 5 days whether symptomatic or not**, or as advised by healthcare provider. No testing for 90 days following positive test or symptom onset. See <https://web.uri.edu/emergency/files/Isolation-Quarantine.pdf> for complete information.
