

Impact of compassion and support

"I have definitely done better in the classes where the teacher really cares...But, when you have a lecture that's filled with 300 students, they're not going to sit down and make sure that every single person is succeeding. But that personalized care definitely does reflect on how well you do in the class because ... it makes you want to go to class because you know that teacher's looking out for you. (URI Student)



Fosters a Sense of Belonging



The impact of belonging

Students who report a sense of belonging also have higher:

- Academic motivation
- Academic success
- Persistence
- Feelings of being valued by their university

(Freeman, Anderman, & Jensen, 2007; Hausmann, Schofield, & Woods, 2007; Hoffman, Richmond, Morrow, & Salomone, 2002; Strayhorn, 2012, 2019; Vaccaro et al., 2017, 2019).

Matters for Persistence & Student Success

Impact of Excellence in Education

"It's awesome when you have professors [who are] willing to work with you. It makes me more confident in my degree and where I'm going in life." (URI Student)

Fosters Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, & Justice

Your commitment to educating/assessing for justice is incredibly important in 2022 as oppressive legislation proliferates restricting educators PK-16 from:

- Teaching about systemic oppression (e.g., anti-CRT)
- Discussing identity (e.g., sexuality and gender)




Impact of your DEIJ commitment

- Trolian & Parker (2022) found students' perceptions of faculty practices and student-faculty interactions was positively associated with both <u>students' openness to</u> <u>diversity and willingness to be challenged</u>
- Decades of literature highlights the importance of faculty reflexivity and commitment to growth (c.f., Salazar et al., 2010; Tuitt et al., 2016)
 - Lightning talks and posters highlight your commitment to growth

Impact of teaching inspired activism

"There are certain people who have come into your life and just make more of a difference than others.
