URI's Gen Ed courses can be taken in any sequence for each outcome. Therefore, the learning data will only tell one part of the story.


The student's "data" enriches the story, and to that end, the two sources of data were integrated in order to produce a data set that can answer a variety of questions about learning within the General Education program.

Rubric Scoring







Observations

- All students appear to struggle most with *critically* evaluating information and its sources
- No group of students was nearing competence
- Juniors and seniors in the sample scored higher than sophomores and freshman (as expected)
