- Maybe ask for sample of what style of writing we are interested in first.
- Thought at first we were at too much of different levels of expertise but it didn't matter.
- I would appreciate more concrete advice with regards to structure, writing process.
- Ask individuals to write on the topic given by you during workshop and correct it and give the feedback.
