BASIC FUNCTION:

Assist the Director in the administration of Counseling Center Services. Assist with case consultation and office administration. Provide direction and support for the delivery of clinical services to university students. Provide leadership with the Center's training programs, including the recruitment, selection, training, and supervision of graduate students and post doctoral fellows. Oversee all didactic programming related to training programs. Share emergency Counseling Center coverage during evenings and weekends. Develop and maintain strong professional relationships with on-campus and off-campus departments and training programs.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Advise, support and consult with the director on matters relating to Counseling Center functioning. Direct the services of the Counseling Center in the absence of the Director.

Provide psychotherapeutic and crisis intervention services to University students. Provide clinical support and supervision to professional staff.
