## Specific Guidelines for RI 8th Grade Gandhi Essay Contest

1. Study the Gandhi quote and explanatory paragraph for this year's essay:

"Earth provides enough to satisfy every person's needs, but not every person's greed."

Most of us know that Gandhi was a moral and political leader, a nonviolent activist, a humanist, and a pacifist. However, few think of Gandhi as an environmentalist. Yet, he was, as were many of his followers. It is quite amazing that he spoke of environmental problems over a hundred years ago, illustrating his insight and farsightedness. Today, Gandhi's perceptiveness is even more relevant as we become aware of the global environmental crisis.

- 2. Research information about Gandhi, his thoughts and ideas, particularly related to the quote. Use numerous resources, such as books, articles, websites.
- 3. Write maximum of 750 words, focused on the three directives:
  - a. Explain what you think Gandhi meant by the above quote.
  - b. Reflect about what the quote means to you personally and to the global climate crisis.
  - c. Describe examples of how Gandhi's ideas could be applied to your school or community.
- 4. Use 12 point Times Roman font.
